

NEW JERSEY HEALTH STATISTICS

1972

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The eleventh annual report of New Jersey Health Statistics provide tabulation of births, marriages, deaths and reportable diseases in New Jersey for calendar year 1972. This year, for the first time, data is also presented on health facilities within New Jersey. This report is designed to provide information of the health status of the people today and to provide health planners with information necessary to meet future health needs in New Jersey.



Report of the Public Health Statistics Program
Calendar Year, 1972

INTRODUCTION: This report, published as a separate document since 1962, presents basic data obtained from original birth, marriage, death and fetal death records filed, as required by law, with the Vital Statistics Registration Program. Birth and death tabulations include data for residents of New Jersey except where otherwise stated, while marriage tabulations include marriages occurring in New Jersey regardless of residency. With regard to birth and death data, tabulations include events to residents of New Jersey occurring within the state, as well as events occurring out of state to New Jersey residents. Since birth and death certificates are only filed in the state in which the event occurred, New Jersey does not maintain original certificates for those events occurring out of state. As a result of a reciprocal arrangement with Vital Statistics Registration Programs in other states, New Jersey receives copies of the original certificates. This year, New York City had difficulty in transmitting copies of the birth and death certificates for residents of New Jersey. The tabulations in this report do not include births occurring in New York City and include only deaths occurring through April 1972 in New York City.

Also included in this report are a number of tables showing tuberculosis and venereal disease morbidity, cases of reportable diseases, population, and health facilities data for general acute hospitals and long term care facilities. The Tuberculosis Services Program collects the required case reports, the Venereal Disease Control Program is responsible for the collection of the confidential reports of syphilis and gonorrhea, and the Communicable Disease Control Program receives reports of all other reportable diseases. Population estimates by place, are provided by the Office of Business Economics, Department of Labor and Industry. Rough estimates of age, sex, and race distributions have been computed by the Public Health Statistics Program based on the total population figures provided by Office of Business Economics. Health facilities data are provided by the Division of Health Facilities.

The format of this publication has been revised. The first set of tables provide historical data; the second set provide data on a statewide basis; the third set provide data on a county and selected city level, followed by a table of basic vital events on a municipality level; and the fourth set of tables provide health facilities data. As an aid to comprehensive health planning agencies throughout the state a table has been appended to the book summarizing data by service area.

The joint efforts of personnel of the above mentioned programs and those of the Public Health Statistics Program, Data Processing and Graphic Art Services made this report possible.

POPULATION: New Jersey's population, estimated at 7,382,985 as of July 1, 1972, shows an increase of 79,985 or 1.1 percent above the 7,303,000 population estimated in mid 1971. The excess of births over deaths (natural increase) was 30,185 or 37.7 percent of the total increase while the net migration figure of 49,800 accounted for 62.3 percent of the total change. While the population grew from 1971 to 1972, the rate of increase is estimated to be the lowest since 1950. Since 1962 New Jersey has experienced a decreasing rate of population increase due to the rapid decrease in the birth rate and a slackening of in-migration.

VITAL EVENTS IN NEW JERSEY: The following table represents vital events occurring in New Jersey and includes events to residents as well as nonresidents. In 1972 there were an estimated 97,776 births in New Jersey representing a decrease of 10.8 percent from 1971 when 109,577 births were reported. The 58,476 marriages represent an increase of 3.4 percent over the 56,531 marriages occurring in 1971 while deaths numbered 67,919 as compared to 67,509 occurring in the preceding year, an increase of 0.6 percent.

BIRTHS OCCURRING IN NEW JERSEY: New Jersey hospitals reported delivering 97,494 babies during 1972, of which three were delivered by registered nurses with the remaining being delivered by physicians. Additionally there were 161 babies delivered outside a hospital by a physician, 120 delivered by nonmedical personnel and one delivered by a midwife. In 1972 there were five licensed midwives in New Jersey and an estimated 25 to 35 registered midwives, who were not licensed.

RESIDENT BIRTHS: The number of births to residents of New Jersey decreased by 11.1 percent in 1972 dropping from 111,376 births in 1971 to 99,050 births in 1972, the lowest number of births since 1950 when there were 97,734. The birth rate in 1971 was 15.2 per 1,000 estimated population, while in 1972 the comparable figure was 13.4, the lowest birth rate since 1937. There were 98,702 babies delivered to residents aged 15-44 resulting in a fertility rate of 65.1 per 1,000 women in this age group. The fertility rate has been on a downward trend since 1960 when it was 106.1. The comparable rates in 1970 and 1971 were 81.2 and 74.0 respectively.

There were an estimated 3,256,000 births throughout the United States, about 9 percent fewer than the number estimated for 1971. The birth rate of 15.6 and the fertility rate of 73.4 experienced nationwide were the lowest levels ever observed since such data was formally collected.

Tabulations on births by race indicate better reporting of this information as there were only eight birth certificates on which race was not reported in 1972 as compared to 535 in 1971 and 1,556 in 1970. Based on complete records, there were 79,024 white babies born in 1972, a decrease of over 10,000 from the 89,385 white babies born the previous year. Nonwhite births amounted to 20,018 as compared to 21,456 in 1971. The decrease in white births amounted to 11.6 percent while nonwhite births declined 6.7 percent.

Several factors may help to explain the decrease in the number of births to New Jersey residents. As was the experience in 1971, births occurring in New York City are not included in the tabulations. If an estimated 1,200 births occurring in New York City were to be included in the tabulations the overall birth rate would be slightly higher and particularly the birth rates for Bergen, Essex and Hudson counties would change, although not appreciably. Better reporting from New York City is hoped for in 1973 with the promised restructuring of their Data Processing Unit.

The legalization of abortions may account for part of the decrease in births. New York City reported 19,800 abortions performed on New Jersey residents. The Family Planning Evaluation Branch of the Center For Disease Control reported an additional 2,989 abortions on New Jersey residents in New York State (excluding New York City) and one abortion in Colorado, New Mexico and North Carolina. Thus there were 22,792 total abortions reported. Excluded are abortions performed in states not presently requiring reporting, which includes New Jersey itself. The effect of legalized abortions on the birth rate cannot be measured in as much as the total number of abortions is unknown, and there is no record of the number of abortions performed prior to its legalization.

Other factors which may contribute to the reduction in the birth rate are the wider use of contraceptives and other birth control methods and the entrance of more women into the labor market.

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY LEGITIMACY: In New Jersey, an illegitimate birth is defined as a birth to a woman who is not married or a birth to a married woman whose husband did not father the child. An item on the New Jersey birth certificate requires an answer to the following: "Legitimate Yes No ". Tabulations are based on the answer given. The terms legitimate and illegitimate are used in this text in accordance with the above definition for lack of more convenient terminology.

In 1972, 12,805 illegitimate resident births were recorded as compared to 12,874 in 1971 and 13,098 in 1970. Although illegitimate births have decreased, the ratio of illegitimate births to total births has increased markedly. In 1970 the figure represented 10.9 percent of all births while in 1971 and 1972, the figures represented 11.6 percent and 12.9 percent of total births respectively. This fact is significant in as much as the number of reported abortions has also increased during this same time period.

Nonwhite illegitimate births (9,063) accounted for 70.8 percent of all illegitimate births and 45.3 percent of all nonwhite births, while white illegitimate births (3,741) represented 29.2 percent of all illegitimate births and 4.7 percent of all white births.

Illegitimate births to teenagers represented 45.9 percent of all illegitimate births, while 8.7 percent of all legitimate births were to teenagers.

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY BIRTH WEIGHT: Birth weight was recorded on all but 196 birth certificates in 1972. Of those births for which weight was recorded, 8.1 percent (7,969) were below 2501 grams and are classified as immature. Birth weight varied little with mothers' ages for those mothers twenty years of age and older. Teenage mothers however, gave birth to 13,396 babies of which 1,629 (12.2 percent) were classified as immature. Of the 277 births to women less than 15 years of

age, 58 (20.9 percent) were immature. There were 2,861 immature nonwhite births representing 14.3 percent of all nonwhite births and 5,108 immature white births representing 6.5 percent of all white births. A total of 1,946 illegitimate births were immature (15.2 percent of total illegitimate births) while 7,969 legitimate births were immature (10.1 percent of total legitimate births).

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY PRENATAL CARE HISTORY: Prenatal care history information is requested on each New Jersey birth certificate in the form of two data items: 1) month of pregnancy prenatal care began and 2) total number of prenatal visits. As is the case of many pieces of information requested on each birth certificate these items are often incompletely answered or not answered at all. In some cases, the answer to one question is inconsistent with the answer to the other. An attempt was made to tabulate data based on the answers to these two data items. The following rules were used in tabulating the data: 1) If the number of prenatal visits was given as none, the mother was considered to have had no prenatal care, regardless of whether a month that prenatal care began was stated 2) If no information was given at all as to the number of prenatal visits, prenatal history was considered unknown, regardless of whether a month of prenatal care was given 3) If the number of prenatal visits was given, but the month that care began was not given, the prenatal visit data was included in total visits, and the birth was tabulated under the column "month... Unknown".

Of the total of 99,050 resident births in 1972, prenatal care information was considered unknown in 7,537 cases (7.6 percent). No prenatal care was given to 1,734 mothers (1.7 percent), prenatal care was begun in the 1st Trimester in 61,363 cases (61.9 percent), in the 2nd Trimester in 22,050 cases (22.3 percent), and in the 3rd Trimester in 5,717 cases (5.8 percent). An additional 649 mothers (0.7 percent) had prenatal care but it was not indicated in which month it began. Of those mothers for whom prenatal history was given there were 864,885 visits or an average of 9.5 visits per birth.

MARRIAGES: The number of marriages performed in New Jersey in 1972 numbered 58,476 as compared to 56,531 in 1971. Since 1959, when 38,659 marriages were performed (6.5 per 1,000 population), each succeeding year has seen an increase in the number of marriages and the marriage rate with the exception of 1971, which had slightly fewer marriages than in 1970 (56,625 in 1970). The 1972 rate of 7.9 marriages per 1,000 population was lower than the nationwide marriage rate of 10.9 based on a provisional figure of 2,269,000 marriages. The United States has likewise experienced a continuous increase in the marriage rate since 1959 with the exception of 1971. The increase in the marriage rates nationwide during the 1960's and 1970's is attributed to the large number of postwar birth cohorts reaching ages at which most marriages are performed (18-24).

MARRIAGES BY MONTH OF OCCURRENCE: The following table exhibits the number of marriages occurring in New Jersey by month and the marriage rate for each month computed on an annual basis, for 1971 and 1972. The greatest number of marriages occurred in June (7,102) and the fewest in February (3,197). The marriage rate in June (11.7) is seen to be the highest while January's annual rate of 5.1 is the lowest. The low rate in March reflects fewer marriages occurring as a result of the Lenten period. Throughout the United States the monthly marriage rate trend is similar with June being the most popular month for marriages (15.4 per 1,000 population nationwide) and January and March being the least popular months (7.9 per 1,000 population).

PREVIOUS MARITAL STATUS: Of the 116,952 persons married, 80.3 percent (93,875) were single, 4.9 percent (5,696) were widowed and 14.8 percent (17,381) were previously married.

Of the 58,476 marriages performed, 73.0 percent were between single brides and single grooms as compared to 74.9 percent in 1971. There were 1,418 marriages between widows and widowers (2.4 percent of all marriages) as compared to 1,461 (2.6 percent) in 1971. Marriages between divorced persons accounted for 7.0 percent (4,120) of all marriages while in 1971 there were 3,358 marriages between divorced persons (5.9 percent of all marriages).

AGE AT MARRIAGE: Most persons who married in 1972 were between the ages of 20-24. 52,779 persons in this age group were married, consisting of 44.8 percent (26,190) of all grooms married and 45.5 percent (26,589) of all brides married. There were 21,220 persons aged 25-29 (18.1 percent of total) married, consisting of 13,025 grooms (22.3 percent of all grooms) and 8,195 brides (14.0 percent of all brides). 14.7 percent of all persons married were less than 20 years of age with almost

three times as many teenage brides as grooms. Teenage brides comprised 21.8 percent (12,768) of all brides while teenage grooms comprised 7.7 percent (4,476) of all grooms. A total of 3,739 marriages were performed between teenagers, with an additional 9,029 marriages between a teenage bride and an older groom and 737 marriages between a teenage groom and an older bride, for a total of 13,505 marriages (23.1 percent of all marriages) involving at least one teenager. Grooms were traditionally older than brides as evidenced by the fact that 25.2 percent of all grooms were over thirty years of age while only 18.7 percent of all brides fell in this category. There were 26,252 marriages involving an older groom and only 4,905 marriages involving an older bride. Further evidence of this traditional phenomenon is the fact that of the 1,063 grooms over age 65, 813 married younger women (76.4 percent) while only 108 of the 494 elderly brides (21.9 percent) married younger men.

RESIDENT DEATHS: The number of New Jersey resident deaths was 68,865 in 1972 an increase of 1.8 percent over the previous year's figure of 67,680. The death rate of 9.3 per 1,000 estimated population was the same as that experienced in 1971. The death rate in New Jersey has gradually decreased since 1948 when there were 10.2 deaths per 1,000 estimated population.

An estimated 1,962,000 deaths occurred in the United States during 1972 producing a rate of 9.4 per 1,000 estimated population. In 1971 the provisional rate was 9.3.

The largest number of resident deaths in New Jersey occurred during the months of January, July and December when 6,755, 6,069 and 6,048 deaths occurred respectively. Fewest deaths occurred during the months of June and September when 5,332 and 5,294 persons died.

RESIDENT INFANT AND FETAL DEATHS: In 1972 there were 1,809 infant deaths, a decrease of 13.7 percent from 1971 when 2,095 babies under one year of age died. Since 1963 when there were 3,177 resident infant deaths, New Jersey has experienced a sharp decrease in both the number of infant deaths and the infant death rate. The infant death rate in 1972 was 18.3 deaths per 1,000 live births as compared to rates of 24.0 and 18.8 in 1963 and 1971 respectively. The infant death rate for New Jersey was the lowest ever recorded, as was the experience nationwide. There were approximately 60,200 infant deaths throughout the United States resulting in an estimated infant mortality rate of 18.5.

The reduction in the number of infant deaths was reflected in the decrease in the deaths of infants under 28 days of age. There were 1,394 neonatal deaths during 1972 as compared to 1,612 in 1971, or a decrease of 13.5 percent. The neonatal death rate dropped from 14.5 in 1971 to 14.1 in 1972. In 1963 there were 2,516 deaths of infants under 28 days of age resulting in a rate of 19.0. While the nation experienced a slightly higher infant mortality rate in 1972, the neonatal mortality rate of 13.7 was slightly lower than that of New Jersey.

The deaths of fetuses reaching the 20th week of gestation are recorded on fetal death certificates. During 1972 there were 1,232 fetal deaths recorded, or 13.5 percent fewer than the 1,441 reported during 1971. The number of fetal deaths per 1,000 live births declined from 12.9 in 1971 to 12.4 in 1972.

Perinatal deaths consist of fetal deaths plus deaths of infants under seven days of age. There were 1,264 deaths of infants under seven days of age or a

total of 2,496 perinatal deaths. The perinatal death rate, expressed as the number of perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births plus fetal deaths, was 24.9 in 1972 as compared to 26.0 in 1971. Since 1963 there has been a 44.8 percent decrease in the number of perinatal deaths.

There were a total of 1,204 white infant deaths and 605 nonwhite infant deaths resulting in infant mortality rates of 15.3 and 30.2 deaths per 1,000 live births respectively. White infant deaths under 28 days numbered 963 or 12.2 per 1,000 live births while the nonwhite neonatal death rate was 21.5 based on 431 deaths. The fetal death rate and perinatal death rate for whites as compared to nonwhites mirrored infant mortality experience. There were 862 white fetal deaths and 1,741 white perinatal deaths resulting in rates of 10.9 and 21.8 respectively, while non-white fetal deaths and perinatal deaths totaled 367 and 752 producing rates of 18.3 and 36.9 respectively. Three fetal death certificates had no report of race and were ignored in the tabulation of race adjusted rates.

Weight was not specified on 139 fetal death certificates (11.3 percent) while 762 (61.8 percent) listed weights of 2500 grams or less and 331 (26.9 percent) showed weights above 2500 grams.

An examination of fetal deaths with respect to legitimacy reveals some interesting results. There were 972 legitimate fetal deaths (78.9 percent of all fetal deaths) and 256 illegitimate fetal deaths (20.8 percent). Legitimacy status was not stated on four fetal death certificates. The terms legitimate and illegitimate, although somewhat inappropriate are again used as previously defined with respect to births. Although there were fewer illegitimate fetal deaths than legitimate fetal deaths there were only 11.3 legitimate fetal deaths per 1,000 legitimate live births as compared to 20.0 illegitimate fetal deaths per 1,000 illegitimate births.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF INFANT MORTALITY: Infant mortality might be classified into three major cause groups, congenital anomalies, certain causes of mortality in early infancy, and all other causes of death. Congenital anomalies accounted for 249 infant deaths in 1972 as compared to 300 in 1971 resulting in a reduction in the mortality rate from 2.7 to 2.5 deaths per 1,000 live births. Within this broad category, congenital anomalies of the heart accounted for 93 infant deaths in 1972. The second broad group, certain causes of mortality in early infancy, totaled 1,122 deaths (11.3 per 1,000 live births) as compared to 1,313 deaths (11.8 per 1,000 live births) in 1971. Within this broad group, 505 deaths were due to anoxic and hypoxic conditions not elsewhere classifiable and 224 deaths resulted from immaturity unqualified. A total of 438 deaths were due to other causes, among them pneumonia (135 deaths) and accidents (31 deaths). A summary of principal causes of infant and neonatal mortality is shown in the following table.

MATERNAL MORTALITY: Despite a slight drop in maternal deaths from 25 in 1971 to 23 in 1972, the maternal mortality rate increased from 2.2 to 2.3 deaths per 10,000 live births. There were 11 deaths of white mothers (1.4 per 10,000 live births) as compared to 12 deaths of nonwhite mothers (6.0 per 10,000 live births). Fifteen mothers over 24 years of age died while eight mothers 24 years of age or younger died.

LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH: The five leading causes of death among residents of New Jersey accounted for 79.4 percent of all deaths in New Jersey. The overall death rate of 932.8 deaths per 100,000 estimated population based on 68,865 deaths represented a slight increase in the death rate over the previous years figure of 926.7 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. Diseases of the heart remained the number one cause of death based on 29,723 deaths, or a rate of 402.6. Malignant neoplasms, the second leading cause of death as in 1972, resulted in 13,616 deaths. The malignant neoplasm mortality rate of 184.4 again represented an increase over the 1971 rate of 179.2. The mortality rates of each of the five leading causes of death increased with the exception of the accident mortality rate of 39.0 which represented a decrease from the 1971 rate of 41.4.

The mortality rate of children 1-4 years of age decreased from 72.0 deaths per 100,000 estimated population to 69.6 deaths per 100,000 population, due mainly to a decrease of 20 percent in the number of deaths due to accidents, the leading cause of death in this age group.

The age-specific death rate of 33.4 deaths per 100,000 children aged 5-14 also represented a lower rate than that of 1971 (32.0). Accidents, malignant neoplasms, congenital anomalies, and influenza and pneumonia remained the four leading causes of death in this age group, with deaths due to homicide, becoming the fifth leading cause of death. There were 17 such deaths in 1972 as compared to only four in 1971.

The mortality rate of 102.9 for persons 15-24 based on 1,189 deaths, represented as in younger age groups, a decrease from 1971 when 1,253 deaths resulted in a rate of 110.0. Causes of death in this age group remained the same as in 1971 with little differences occurring in each disease specific mortality rate.

The mortality rate of persons 25-44 decreased slightly, while that of persons 45-64 and 65 years of age and older increased. Malignant neoplasms became the leading cause of death in the 25-44 old age groups, with diseases of the heart ranking second, based on age-specific rates of 38.7 and 35.8 respectively.

Mortality rates due to specific causes vary not only with age, but also with respect to race and sex. An examination of each of the principal causes of death reveal differences in mortality rates and in some cases, differences in the ranking of importance of the specific cause of death with respect to other causes of death.

MAJOR CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES: During 1972 there were 38,061 deaths attributed to major cardiovascular diseases, as compared to 37,492 similar deaths in 1971. The comparative mortality rates were 515.5 deaths per 100,000 estimated population in 1972 as compared to 513.4 in 1971.

Cardiovascular diseases can be grouped into five disease categories, diseases of the heart, hypertension, cerebrovascular disease, arteriosclerosis and other diseases of arteries, arterioles and capillaries.

Diseases of the heart remained the principal cause of death of New Jersey residents of all ages, and was the principal cause of death of residents over 45 years of age, and the second leading cause of death of residents 25-44 years of age. The mortality rate of 402.6 was higher than the national mortality rate of 361.3 due to this disease category. Deaths due to diseases of the heart were more prevalent among the white population than the nonwhite population. The mortality rate of white males was 473.2 as compared to a rate of 293.0 among nonwhite males. Similarly, the mortality rate of white females (370.8) was higher than that of nonwhite females (237.8). Deaths due to diseases of the heart were the primary cause of death regardless of sex or race.

Hypertension was the cause of death of 232 persons during 1972. The mortality rate of 3.1 deaths per 100,000 estimated population was lower than the United States figure of 3.7 based on an estimated 7,680 deaths nationwide. Hypertension, as with other major cardiovascular diseases, was more prevalent in persons 45 years of age and older. There were no reported deaths due to this category in persons under 25 years of age.

Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death of white males, white females and nonwhite females and the fourth leading cause of death of nonwhite males. The mortality rate of 87.1 was slightly higher than the 1971 rate of 85.7 and lower than the national rate of 100.9. Women experienced higher mortality rates than men and white persons experienced higher mortality rates than nonwhite persons of the same sex. The mortality rate of white females was 98.6 as compared to a mortality rate of 77.6 for white males. Nonwhite females had a mortality rate of 79.8 as compared to a mortality rate of 74.2 for nonwhite males. Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death among persons 45 years of age and older and was again of lesser importance in earlier age groups.

Arteriosclerosis resulted in 831 deaths of which 797 were persons over 65 years of age. The mortality rate of 11.3 deaths per 100,000 persons was only slightly higher than that in 1971 (11.0), and appreciably lower than the national mortality rate of 15.8.

Deaths due to other diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries accounted for 843 deaths and a mortality rate of 11.4, only slightly higher than 1971's rate of 11.3. Of the total of 843 deaths 647 (76.7 percent) were persons over 65 years of age, and 174 (20.6 percent) were persons 45-64 years of age.

CANCER: During 1972 there were 13,616 deaths due to malignant neoplasms and 153 additional deaths due to benign neoplasms and neoplasms of unspecified nature. The malignant neoplasms mortality rate of 184.4 represented an increase over the rates for 1971 and 1972 and was higher than the United States mortality rates of 166.6. White persons experienced higher mortality rates than nonwhite persons and men experienced appreciably higher rates than women of the same ethnic background. The white male mortality rate was 209.2 as compared to a rate of 173.4 for white

females. Nonwhite males experienced a mortality rate of 154.5 as compared to a rate of 117.6 for nonwhite females. In addition to being the second leading cause of death regardless of race or sex, malignant neoplasms were the primary cause of death among all persons aged 25-44 and the second leading cause of death among persons 45 years of age and older, and persons 5-14 years of age.

ACCIDENTS: Accidents resulted in the deaths of 2,878 persons during 1972 as compared to 3,021 such deaths in 1971. While the mortality rate decreased from 41.4 deaths per 100,000 persons in 1971 to 39.0 deaths in 1972, accidents remained the principal cause of death of persons below the age of 25, and the third leading cause of death of persons 25-44 years of age. Although representing only the 7th leading cause of death of the elderly, the largest percentage of all accidental deaths (26.1 percent) occurred to persons in the 65 and older age group.

White male deaths due to accidents resulted in a mortality rate of 49.3 as compared to a white female mortality rate of 24.7. The nonwhite male mortality rate of 88.8 was almost twice that of white males and over three times that of nonwhite females (29.1).

The United States provisional accident mortality rate of 54.6 represented an increase over the 1971 rate of 53.8.

Motor vehicle traffic accidents resulted in the deaths of 1,247 residents of which the greatest number (345) were between the ages of 15 and 24, and 318 were between the ages of 25 and 44. An additional 20 deaths were attributed to motor vehicle non-traffic accidents. The motor vehicle traffic accident mortality rate of 16.9 was lower than that of 1971 (17.7).

Falls caused the death of 621 residents of which 439 (70.7 percent) were 65 years of age or older.

INFLUENZA AND PNEUMONIA: During 1972 there were 2,018 deaths due to influenza and pneumonia of which 1,923 were classified as deaths due to pneumonia. Of the total deaths attributed to influenza and pneumonia, 1,314 were deaths of persons

65 years of age and older. Males experienced higher mortality rates than females. The white male mortality rate was 30.2 while that for white females was 23.2. Similarly, the nonwhite male mortality rate was 45.1 as compared to a rate of 22.1 for nonwhite females.

DIABETES MELLITUS: Diabetes mellitus was the sixth leading cause of death in 1971 and 1972. The 1972 diabetes mortality rate of 20.1 based on 1,480 deaths represented a slight decrease over the 1971 rate of 20.9 but remained above the United States mortality rate of 18.8. Deaths from diabetes are more prevalent among the elderly and among women with no significant difference in rates with respect to race. Of the total of 1,480 deaths 70.1 percent (1,037) of the deaths were persons 65 years of age and older. Females experienced a mortality rate of 23.1 per 100,000 women, while men experienced a mortality rate of 16.8. The female age-specific mortality rate for women 65 years of age and older was 156.8 while the male age-specific mortality rate was 127.0.

HOMICIDE: Homicide has in the past and continues to be, one of the principal causes of death of persons 15-44 years of age and in 1972 was a leading cause of death of persons 5-14 years of age. Of the 484 homicide deaths in 1972, 341 were persons aged 15-44. There were an additional 17 deaths of persons 5-14 years of age, due to homicide as compared to only three in 1971, making homicide the fifth leading cause of death in this age group in 1972. There were 115 deaths due to homicide in the 15-24 year age group resulting in a mortality rate of 9.9, the second highest mortality rate in this age group. The fifth leading cause of death in 25-44 year olds, homicide resulted in 226 deaths and a mortality rate of 12.6.

Legal intervention resulted in an additional 15 deaths bringing the total number of deaths due to homicide and legal intervention to 499. The homicide and legal intervention mortality rate of 6.8 was lower than the United States rate of 9.1. There were 234 deaths of nonwhite males producing a mortality rate of 58.7 as compared to mortality rates of 5.4, 1.3, and 11.3 for white males, white females and nonwhite females respectively. The 125 deaths of nonwhite males aged 25-44 made homicide and legal intervention the principal cause of death in that age-race-sex group.

SUICIDE: Since 1970 the suicide rate in New Jersey has increased from 6.8 deaths per 100,000 persons to 8.4 deaths per 100,000. The 1972 rate was based on 617 deaths, of which 432 were men. The mortality rate for males was 12.1, while the female mortality rate was 4.9 based on 185 deaths. White males exhibited the highest mortality rate (12.3) among the race-sex groups. The mortality rate of white females was 5.3. Nonwhite males had a mortality rate of 10.5, while only seven deaths were recorded for nonwhite females producing a rate of 1.6.

There were 98 deaths due to suicide of persons 15-24 years of age making suicide the third leading cause of death in this age group, with a mortality rate of 8.5. Suicides accounted for 194 deaths of persons 25-44 years of age and a mortality rate of 10.8. The highest age-specific mortality rate, however, occurs in the 45-64 year age group. The 193 suicide deaths in this age group produced a mortality rate of 11.6.

Throughout the United States the suicide mortality rate has increased. In 1971 the rate was 11.1, increasing to 11.7 in 1972.

OTHER SELECTED CAUSES OF DEATH: Cirrhosis of the liver resulted in the death of 1,384 residents in 1972, producing a mortality rate of 18.7. The comparable figure for the United States was 15.7. Higher mortality rates were seen for males than

for females and for nonwhites than whites. The white male mortality rate was 22.8 while the nonwhite male mortality rate was 37.1. The white female mortality rate was 12.6 while the nonwhite female mortality rate was 20.5.

Emphysema resulted in the deaths of 576 persons during 1972 or 7.8 deaths per 100,000 persons. The white male mortality rate of 13.8 was by far the highest rate among different race-sex groups. Nonwhite males, in comparison, had a mortality rate of 6.8; white females, a mortality rate of 3.1; and nonwhite females, a mortality rate of 1.1. An additional 199 persons died of chronic bronchitis while 56 died of asthma. The total mortality due to these three disease conditions was 831 resulting in a mortality rate of 11.3, slightly lower than the United States figure of 13.8, and equivalent to the 1971 rate.

Tuberculosis resulted in 166 deaths in 1972 as compared to 217 such deaths in 1971. The mortality rate of 2.2 was lower than the 1970 and 1971 rates of 3.4 and 3.0 respectively.

NOTIFIABLE DISEASE MORBIDITY: The number of active cases of tuberculosis as well as total cases of tuberculosis decreased from 1971 to 1972 resulting in sharp decreases in the tuberculosis morbidity rates. In 1971 there were 1,426 active cases and 2,118 total cases of tuberculosis reported in New Jersey resulting in morbidity rates of 19.5 and 29.0 cases per 100,000 estimated population. The 1972 number of active cases reported decreased to 1,211, and total cases decreased to 1,692. The active case morbidity rate was 16.4 and the total case morbidity rate was 22.9. The highest age-specific total case morbidity rate was 39.0 for persons 65 years of age and older, with little difference in the age-specific morbidity rate of those 25-44 (31.2) and those 45-64 (33.8). More total cases were reported for males (1,093) than females (599) as evidenced by morbidity rates of 30.6 per 100,000 persons and 15.7, for males and females, respectively. The number of total cases and the resulting morbidity rates have been on an unsteady decline since 1953 when 4,189 cases were reported resulting in a morbidity rate of 79.9.

Syphilis and gonorrhea remain two of the leading health problems in the State of New Jersey as well as nationwide. In 1971 there were 6,102 cases of syphilis, of which 966 were classified as primary or secondary, and 621 as early latent. The syphilis morbidity rate for all stages was 83.6; for primary and secondary syphilis, 13.2; and for early latent, 8.5 per 100,000 estimated population. In 1972, a total of 2,688 cases of syphilis were tabulated, of which 974 were classified as primary or secondary, and 619 as early latent syphilis. The sharp decrease in the number of new cases of syphilis in 1972 is not representative of improving health measures in combating this disease, but rather, improved tabulation of data, especially data with respect to cases of late latent syphilis. The 1972 morbidity rate for all stages of syphilis combined was 36.4, while the morbidity rate for primary and secondary syphilis remained the same as in 1971. The morbidity rate for early latent syphilis was 8.4.

In 1972 a total of 17,882 cases of gonorrhea were reported as compared to 12,118 cases in 1971. The comparative morbidity rates were 242.2 and 165.9 in 1972 and 1971 respectively.

Both syphilis and gonorrhea are most prevalent in the age group 20-24. The age-specific morbidity rate for all stages of syphilis was 113.1 cases per 100,000 estimated population, and for gonorrhea, 1,219.2 per 100,000 estimated population.

A total of 983 cases of serum hepatitis and 1,915 cases of infectious hepatitis were reported in 1972 resulting in morbidity rates of 13.3 and 25.9 cases

per 100,000 estimated population. Both serum hepatitis and infectious hepatitis were more prevalent among males than females. There were 695 cases of serum hepatitis among men and 288 cases among women producing morbidity rates of 19.5 and 7.6 respectively. A total of 1,156 cases of infectious hepatitis were recorded for males as compared to 759 for females producing morbidity rates of 32.4 and 19.9 respectively. Both serum and infectious hepatitis were most prevalent among persons aged 20-24, followed by persons aged 15-19, irrespective of sex. Persons aged 20-24 accounted for 363 cases of serum hepatitis (36.9 percent of all serum hepatitis cases) and 537 cases of infectious hepatitis (28.0 percent of all infectious cases), while persons aged 15-19 reported 321 cases of serum hepatitis (32.7 percent of total) and 420 cases of infectious hepatitis (21.9 percent of total).

Among other notifiable diseases reported there were 1,227 cases of rubella (16.6 per 100,000 estimated population), 535 cases of measles (rubeola) (7.2 per 100,000), 1,103 cases of mumps (14.9 per 100,000), 1,130 cases of salmonellosis (excluding typhoid fever) (15.3 per 100,000), 370 cases of aseptic meningitis (5.0 per 100,000), and 333 cases of shigellosis (bacillary, dysentery) (4.5 per 100,000).

HEALTH FACILITIES: The statistics reflected in the January 1, 1971 to December 31, 1971 inventory period were unanimously adopted by the Health Care Administration Board, in the State Department of Health, to achieve the objectives set forth in Chapters 136-138, Laws of New Jersey 1971, known as the Health Care Facilities Planning Act.

The State Health Planning Council, Comprehensive Area-Wide Planning Council are the recognized agencies carrying out the purpose of this Act.

The data shown in Tables 42 and 43, was extracted from the 1973 New Jersey State Plan For Hospitals and Related Health Care Services, published by the Division of Health Facilities. Table 42 contains data on the number of hospital beds by type of bed, in general acute hospitals, excluding long-term care beds, while Table 43 contains information on the number of beds, by type, in long-term care facilities. Both tables summarize data by primary service area, and within each primary service area, by county.

APPENDIX A

Glossary of Terms

AGE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - The number of deaths of persons of a given age group per 100,000 estimated persons in that age group usually expressed as an annual rate.

CAUSE GROUP - a summary of deaths resulting from, or cases of, related diseases as defined by the International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States, published by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; usually specified by a series of 3-digit codes i.e. 140-209 - malignant neoplasms.

CAUSE-3 DIGIT - the cause of death or morbidity as defined by a 3-digit code in the International List. Disease conditions are also further classified and so specified, by the addition of a decimal point and a fourth digit. For example, the three digit code "140" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lip, and the four digit code "140.1" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lower lip.

ESTIMATED POPULATION - the estimated number of persons in a given group based on the latest census data and adjusted for annual births, annual deaths and net migration.

FETAL DEATH - a death prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy also known as a stillbirth. The death of an infant that has breathed or shown other evidence of life, no matter for how short a period, should be reported as a live birth and an infant death.

FETAL DEATH RATES - the number of fetal deaths occurring in the twentieth week of gestation or later (required by law to be registered as fetal deaths) per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

FERTILITY RATE - the number of live births to women aged 15-44 per 1,000 women in this age group, usually expressed as an annual rate.

ILLEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to an unwed mother, or to a mother whose husband did not father the infant.

ILLEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to an unwed mother, or a mother whose husband did not father the fetus.

INFANT DEATH - the death of a baby under one year of age, no matter how short a period of time the baby breathed or shown other evidence of life.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE - the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

INTERNATIONAL LIST - a listing of disease classifications known as the "International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States", published by the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, used in the statistical coding and tabulation of specific disease morbidity and mortality.

LEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to a married woman whose husband fathered the infant.

LEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to a married woman whose husband fathered the fetus.

MATERNAL DEATH - a death of a woman occurring during the period of pregnancy or following delivery of the infant and related to the pregnancy or delivery of the infant.

MATERNAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

MORBIDITY - the relative incidence (number of cases) of disease, usually used with respect to specific disease conditions i.e. tuberculosis morbidity refers to the number of cases of tuberculosis.

MORTALITY - the number of deaths.

NEONATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the newborn and especially the human infant during the first month of life.

NEONATAL MORTALITY RATE - as used in this text, the number of deaths of infants under 28 days of age per 1,000 live births, per year.

NET MIGRATION - the difference in population resulting from persons attaining residency status, and persons dropping residency status, often referred to as in-migration and out-migration, respectively.

PERINATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the fetus and the newborn, especially the human infant during the first week of life.

PERINATAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of infants less than seven days of age, and registered fetal deaths per 1,000 live births plus registered fetal deaths.

RACE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths in a given ethnic group per 100,000 estimated population in that ethnic group.

SELECTED PLACES - as used in this report, cities, townships and municipalities with a population of 45,000 or more as of the 1970 census.

SEX-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of males/females per 100,000 estimated males/females in the population.
