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**Report of the Public Health Statistics Program
Calendar Year, 1974**

INTRODUCTION: This report contains a summary of data tabulated from birth, marriage, death and fetal death certificates required by law to be filed with the state registrar. Included are all events occurring during calendar year 1974, and reported prior to May 1, 1975. Resident birth, death and fetal death tabulations include resident information irregardless of the place in which the event occurred. These tabulations are made possible through a reciprocal agreement between states allowing for the exchange of copies of nonresident certificates to be used for statistical purposes. All marriage data presented in this report is by place of occurrence, irrespective of the residence of the bride and groom.

The Tuberculosis Services Program provided the tuberculosis morbidity data included in this report, while the Venereal Disease Control Program, which is responsible for the collection of confidential reports of syphilis and gonorrhea, submitted data with respect to these diseases. Also included in this report is data generated by the Communicable Disease Control Program regarding other reportable diseases.

The Office of Business Economics, of the Department of Labor and Industry was given the responsibility by the Governor's Office to provide annual estimates of the population of New Jersey and its 567 municipalities. These estimates are periodically revised to reflect the latest information available with respect to births, deaths, and migration. The population estimates published on January 3, 1975 by that program, were used in preparing the birth, marriage, mortality and morbidity rates appearing in this report. Any discrepancies between the rates appearing in this report and rates reported in prior reports is due to revisions in the population estimates. Age, race and sex specific population estimates were prepared by the Public Health Statistics Program utilizing the latest population estimates and the population distribution as of April, 1970, published by the U. S. Census Bureau.

Included in an appendix to this report is a table presenting provisional mortality rates for 1973 and 1974 for the United States by selected cause groups by age. This table was prepared by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Health Resources Administration, National Center for Health Statistics, and appears, as is, in the Monthly Vital Statistics Report, Annual Summary for 1974, prepared by this same group. Their cooperation in allowing us to reproduce this table is appreciated.

The joint efforts of personnel of the above mentioned programs and those of the Public Health Statistics Program, Data Processing, and Graphic Art Services, made this report possible. Additional data not appearing in this report can be obtained, upon request, from the Public Health Statistics Program.

POPULATION: The population of New Jersey as of July 1, 1974 was estimated as 7,413,680, an increase of 0.57 percent over the July 1, 1973 estimate of 7,371,835. While the population has continued to grow, the rate of growth has decreased. The relative change in the population size is the smallest

since the 1943-1944 period when the population was actually estimated to have decreased. Eighteen of New Jersey's twenty-one counties increased in population size with Ocean County exhibiting the greatest relative increase (2.78%). The counties of Burlington, Essex and Hudson each showed population decreases of less than one-tenth of one percent, and were the only counties with estimated decreases. The decreasing rate of growth for the entire period 1970-1973 can be attributed to a decline in the birth rate. In addition, for the period July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974, there appears to have been a dramatic decrease in net migration (22.8%), with the increasing unemployment rate in New Jersey during that period resulting in increased out-migration and reduced in-migration.

New Jersey covers a land area of 7,521 square miles resulting in a population density of 985.7 persons per square mile as of July 1, 1974. In 1970, New Jersey's population density was exceeded only by that of the District of Columbia.

The latest population estimates for the United States⁽¹⁾ for July 1, 1974 and July 1, 1973 were 211,894,000 and 210,410,000. The change represents an increase of 0.70 percent, slightly higher than that for New Jersey.

VITAL EVENTS IN NEW JERSEY: In 1974 there were 91,852 births to residents as well as nonresidents which took place in New Jersey. This figure represents a decrease of 1.02 percent over the 1973 total of 92,798 births. Tabulations made from all birth records filed with the State Registrar indicate a total of 91,624 births delivered in hospitals, of which 297 were delivered by registered nurses. In 1973 only 31 births were reportedly delivered by registered nurses in hospitals. Physicians and osteopaths delivered 95 babies in homes during 1974, while 133 births were delivered elsewhere. As was the case in 1973, there were more deliveries during the months of July and August, and fewer deliveries during February and April, than were reported for any other months.

A total of 65,782 persons died in New Jersey during 1974, as compared with 67,413 deaths for the preceding year, a decrease of 2.4 percent. There were 6,234 deaths in March of 1974 as compared with 5,659 deaths one year earlier, an increase of 10.2%. In contrast there were 5,916 deaths in January of 1974 as compared with 6,563 deaths one year prior, a decrease of 9.9%.

RESIDENT BIRTHS: During 1974 there were 94,242 births to residents of New Jersey as compared to 94,024 births in 1973. The resulting birth rate of 12.7 equalled the 1973 rate which was the lowest birth rate recorded since statewide statistics were first tabulated in 1879. There were 93,882 births to women aged 15 to 44 resulting in an estimated fertility rate of 61.6, based on the estimated population of women in that age group. The fertility rate was also identical to that recorded in 1973.

There were 74,131 white births, 18,485 nonwhite births and 1,626 births for which race was not determined. In 1973 there were 726 births for which race was not determined. This large increase in unknowns has hindered attempts to accurately determine any race-specific birth trends. Based on the known number of white and nonwhite births, it appears that the white birth rate has remained the same (11.3) while the nonwhite birth rate has declined (22.7 in 1973 as compared to 21.9 in 1974). Addition of the unknown births to either racial category would result in race-specific birth rates higher than those recorded in 1973. Because of the large number of births unknown as to race, race-specific birth, infant death and fetal death rates have not been computed and do not appear in any tables in this report.

Provisional Statistics published by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare⁽²⁾ indicate an estimated 3,166,000 births during 1974 with a birth rate of 15.0. The number of births increased one percent over the 1973 estimate of 3,141,000. The fertility rate for 1974 was 68.4 as compared with the 1973 estimate of 69.3. The increase in births was due to a two percent increase in the number of women in childbearing ages. The United States Bureau of the Census projects an increase of 12% in the number of women of childbearing age by 1980. The projected increase in the number of women aged 20-29 is 14% by 1980. This factor may tend to increase the birth rate, despite decreases in the fertility rate.

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY LEGITIMACY: In New Jersey, an illegitimate birth is defined as a birth to a woman who is not married, or a birth to a married woman whose husband did not father the child. An item on the New Jersey birth certificate requires an answer to the following: "Legitimate Yes No ". Tabulations are based on the answer given. The terms legitimate and illegitimate are used in this report in accordance with the above definition for lack of more convenient terminology.

During 1974 there were 13,825 illegitimate births in New Jersey, an increase of 2.2 percent over the reported 13,526 illegitimate births reported

in 1973. The percentage of total births classified as illegitimate has continually increased since 1970, when 10.9 percent were so classified. In 1971, 1972, and 1973 the percentages of illegitimate births were 11.6, 12.9, and 14.4 respectively. In 1974 the percentage increased to 14.7. Of the total of 18,485 births classified as nonwhite, 9,012 were illegitimate (48.8%). In 1973 48.1 percent of all nonwhite births were classified as illegitimate. Similarly the percent of illegitimate white births increased from 4.9 percent in 1973 to 6.2% in 1974. There were 4,626 white illegitimate births in 1974 as compared to 3,616 such births in 1973, an increase of 27.9%. Forty-seven percent of illegitimate births involved mothers under 20 years of age, with no overwhelming differences in the age patterns of whites and nonwhites.

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY BIRTH WEIGHT: In 1974 a total of 1,570 birth certificates did not have information recorded with respect to birth weight. Of the remaining 92,672 births for which this information was available, 7,207 (7.8%) were births of low birth weight (2500 grams or less), commonly referred to as immature births. The percentage of immature births was the same in 1973. Low birth weight appears to be correlated to any of several factors including race, age of mother, and legitimacy, although data is insufficient to draw any firm conclusions. Of the 74,025 white births for which birth weight information was available 4,653 (6.3%) were classified as immature. There were 18,465 nonwhite births with birth weight recorded, of which 2,533 (13.7%) were immature. A total of 1,567 births to teenage mothers (11.9% of all teenage births) were immature. Of the total of 13,825 illegitimate births, 14.7% were immature. There were 1,001 illegitimate births of 2500 grams or less to teenage mothers, or 15.4% of all illegitimate births to teenagers.

MARRIAGES: With the exception of 1971, the number of marriages performed in New Jersey has continually increased since 1958, while the marriage rate has increased since 1962. In 1974, however, there were 5.5 percent fewer marriages performed in New Jersey (56,449), than there were in 1973 (59,723). The result was a drop in the marriage rate from 8.1 to 7.6 marriages per 1,000 persons in the population. The marriage rate for the United States was 10.5 in 1974, as compared to 10.9 in 1973. "The number of marriages declined in almost every part of the United States but the decline was most pronounced in the Northeast.... Separately, 32 states and the District of Columbia reported a decline in the number and the rate of marriages." (3) Although the data for New Jersey represents marriages occurring in New Jersey, rather than marriages of New Jersey residents, one can safely assume that New Jersey residents followed similar patterns as seen throughout most of the United States.

June, August and September were, as usual, the most popular months for marriage. The proceeding table indicates the number of marriages performed in 1973 and 1974 with accompanying annualized rates. Marriages in December decreased 13.8 percent, while marriages in September decreased 13.2 percent. August and November were the only months in which the number of marriages increased. Nationwide, monthly marriage rates either declined or remained the same, with June, July and August being the most popular months for marriage.

Of the 112,898 persons married during 1974, 88,107 (78.0 percent) were never married before, 5,167 (4.6 percent) were widowed persons, and 19,624 (17.4 percent) were divorced persons. In 1973 79.2 percent of persons marrying were never married before, while 16.2 percent were married one or more previous times. In 1973 there were 4,120 marriages involving two previously married persons (7.8% of all marriages), while in 1974 there were 4,813 such marriages (8.5% of all marriages). The number of marriages between persons never married before has decreased over the last three years. In 1972 there were 42,687 such marriages (73.0 percent of all marriages), in 1973 there were 42,556 such marriages (71.3 percent), and in 1974 only 39,375 such marriages representing 69.8 percent of all marriages, took place. Apparently, more persons who have tried it before are willing to try it again, and fewer persons who have never tried it before are willing to try it for the first time.

Changes in marriage patterns become even more apparent when examining age at marriage. Since 1968 the average age at marriage for both brides and grooms has gradually increased. In 1968 the average age was 25.0 years for brides and 27.6 years of age for grooms. In 1974, the average age of brides was 25.9 years, and grooms 28.5 years. In 1973 26.2 percent of grooms were over 30 years of age, while in 1974 27.1 percent of grooms were over 30 years of age. Similarly, in 1973, 19.2 percent of brides were over 30 years of age while the 1974 figure was 19.5%. In 1974 there were 11,882 teenage brides (21.0 percent of all brides) while in 1973 there were 13,290 teenage brides (22.3 percent of all brides). The 1974 total of 4,456 teenage grooms (7.9% of all grooms) represented a decrease from the reported 5,083 teenage grooms (8.5 percent of all grooms) in 1973. There were 3,631 marriages involving two teenagers, as compared with 4,198 such marriages in 1973. In addition, 8,251 teenage girls married men over 20 years of age as compared with 9,092 in 1973. Another 825 teenage grooms married women 20 years of age or older. In all there were 12,707 marriages involving at least one teenager in 1974, as compared with 14,175 such marriages in 1973, a decrease of 10.4 percent.

RESIDENT DEATHS: In 1974 there were 66,728 New Jersey resident deaths as compared to 68,605 such deaths in 1973. The decrease of 2.7% resulted in an overall mortality rate of 9.0 deaths per 1,000 estimated population, compared to a rate of 9.3 in 1973. There were 35,971 male deaths in 1974 as compared to 37,024 deaths in 1973, a decrease of 2.8 percent resulting in a mortality rate of 10.0 in 1974 as compared to 10.3 in 1973. Similarly, female deaths decreased 2.6 percent, resulting in a mortality rate of 8.0 compared with 8.3 deaths per 1,000 population in 1973. White male deaths decreased 3.0 percent, while nonwhite male deaths decreased 1.8 percent resulting in mortality rates of 10.1 and 9.6 respectively. In 1973 the white and nonwhite male mortality rates were 10.4 and 9.8 respectively. There were 27,839 white female deaths in 1974 as compared to 28,474 such deaths in 1973, a decrease of 2.2 percent, producing a mortality rate of 8.2. Nonwhite female deaths showed the greatest decrease, 6.1 percent, producing a rate of 6.5, compared with the 1973 mortality rate of 7.0 deaths per 1,000 nonwhite females in the population.

The greatest contributing factor to the decrease in the mortality rate in New Jersey is probably the reduction in deaths due to heart disease, the

leading cause of death. There were 1,007 fewer deaths due to heart disease in 1974 as compared with 1973. A second contributing factor has to be the decrease of 15.9 percent in motor vehicle deaths in 1974. There were 1,120 such deaths in 1974, compared with 1,331 motor vehicle deaths in 1973.

Similar experiences were seen throughout the United States as the number of deaths decreased 2.2 percent, resulting in a reduced mortality rate of 9.1 per 1,000 persons in the population. The death rate due to heart disease decreased from 360.8 to 353.1 deaths per 100,000 population. Motor vehicle deaths were reduced dramatically as the mortality rate dropped from 26.5 to 21.3 deaths per 100,000. Sex-race specific rates dropped in all groups. The white male mortality rate was 10.5 per 1,000 while the nonwhite male rate was 10.3. The white and nonwhite female mortality rates were 8.0 and 7.1 respectively. Interestingly, in 1973 the nonwhite male mortality rate in the United States was higher than the white male mortality rate contrary to New Jersey's experience. In 1974 mortality rates were higher for white males than nonwhite males, similar to New Jersey's experience.

RESIDENT INFANT AND FETAL DEATHS: Infant mortality has continued to show dramatic decreases each year. The mortality rate in 1974 was 16.1 infant deaths per 1,000 live births, a 6.5 percent decrease from the rate of 17.2 recorded in 1973. The mortality rate is the lowest ever recorded in New Jersey and was based on 1,513 infant deaths. There were approximately 52,400 infant deaths throughout the United States also producing the lowest annual rate (16.5) ever recorded.

There were 1,132 deaths of infants 28 days of age or younger, resulting in a neonatal mortality rate of 12.0, also the lowest rate ever recorded in New Jersey. The reduction in neonatal deaths was 7.4 percent over the previous years reported figure of 1,223 neonatal deaths. By contrast, in 1964 there were more than twice as many neonatal deaths, with a neonatal mortality rate of 18.2. The estimated mortality rate for the United States in 1974 was 12.1, while the comparative 1973 rate was 13.0.

Fetal deaths (stillbirths) are required by New Jersey law, to be reported to the State Registrar if they occur after completion of the 20th week of gestation. Requirements differ from state to state, often making comparisons of statistics difficult. The American Association of Vital Records and Public Health Statistics, in conjunction with other agencies involved in vital statistics reporting periodically revises the model law, and the United States Standard Certificates of Birth, Death and Fetal Death, used by most state registrars as guides in the development of state certificates and laws. These revisions are undergone to conform with changing needs and attitudes in the medical field. One recommended change involves the reporting of fetal deaths. The latest revision in the model law, which will become effective in 1978 recommends the reporting by all states of fetal deaths occurring beyond the twentieth week of gestation through use of fetal death statistical report forms, rather than fetal death certificates, and the reporting of all abortions performed, through use of an abortion reporting form. Whether these recommended revisions will in fact be adopted as part of the model law, and by the State of New Jersey, remains to be seen.

In 1974 there were a reported 1,027 fetal deaths in New Jersey compared with 1,183 such deaths in 1973, a decrease of 13.2 percent. The fetal death mortality rate dropped from 12.6 in 1973 to 10.9 in 1974. As with infant deaths, the fetal death mortality rate represents the lowest ever recorded in New Jersey.

The definition of perinatal mortality differs from state to state. The latest definition of a perinatal death recommended by the World Health Organization, differing somewhat from their earlier recommended definition, is the one which has consistently been used in New Jersey. Perinatal mortality is defined as mortality of an infant under seven days of age, plus fetal deaths occurring beyond the 20th week of gestation.

In 1974 there were 2,031 perinatal deaths in New Jersey (1,027 fetal deaths plus 1,004 deaths of infants not completing the seventh day of life). The perinatal mortality rate was 21.3 in 1974 as compared with a rate of 23.8 in 1973. The denominator used in this calculation is the total of fetal deaths plus live births. Some states have included in the calculation all neonatal deaths. In New Jersey this would involve an additional 128 infant deaths occurring beyond the first week of life but prior to completion of the 28th day of life. The resultant rate would be 22.0 perinatal deaths per 1,000 live births plus infant deaths.

There were 1,038 white infant deaths and 475 nonwhite infant deaths in 1974, as compared with 1,084 white and 534 nonwhite infant deaths in 1973. As has been mentioned earlier, race-specific infant and fetal mortality rates have not been computed due to an excessive number of deaths unknown as to race. There were 805 white neonatal deaths and 327 nonwhite neonatal deaths in 1974 as compared with 844 and 379 neonatal deaths, respectively, in 1973. There were four fetal deaths with no race information. Of the remainder, 768 were classified as white and 255 as nonwhite. In 1973, five fetal death certificates did not list race. There were 830 white fetal deaths and 348 nonwhite fetal deaths. Despite the fact that race-specific rates have not been calculated, one can safely state that nonwhite infant and fetal mortality rates remained higher than white mortality rates. Whether any or all of the race-specific rates decreased, cannot be ascertained however.

There were 132 fetal deaths with respect to teenage mothers, resulting in an age-specific fetal death rate of 10.0. By contrast there were 891 fetal deaths to mothers over 20 years of age, with a resulting rate of 11.0. The age-specific fetal death mortality rate for women 40 years of age and older was 39.1.

Of the total of 908 fetal deaths for which weight was given, 622 weighed 2500 grams or less (68.5%). In 1973 68.1 were so classified.

Using the term "legitimate", in the same context as was defined earlier, there were 826 "legitimate" fetal deaths as compared with 197 "illegitimate" fetal deaths, with four fetal death certificates lacking this information. Although not generally done, one could compute a "legitimate fetal death rate" versus an "illegitimate fetal death rate". There were, in fact, 10.3

legitimate fetal deaths per 1,000 legitimate persons, and 14.2 illegitimate fetal deaths per 1,000 illegitimate live births. One must bear in mind that fetal deaths include only those occurring beyond the 20th week of gestation, and therefore do not include legal abortions.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF INFANT MORTALITY: The ten leading causes of infant mortality are shown in the preceding table. The leading cause of death is congenital anomalies, accounting for 271 deaths under one year of age. This broad category includes deaths due to heart defects (96), anencephalus (23), other circulatory disease deaths (19), and spina bifida (18). Table 13 gives a complete breakdown of infant deaths by cause and age.

The number of deaths due to congenital anomalies increased 4.2 percent from the 260 reported in 1973. Deaths due to respiratory distress syndrome increased 4.0 percent with 151 such deaths reported in 1973. By contrast, deaths attributed to asphyxia of the newborn decreased 30.7 percent over the reported 199 such deaths in 1973. Pneumonia deaths were reduced 37.4 percent based on 115 such deaths reported in 1973. In 1973 there were 133 deaths attributed to complications of pregnancy compared with 113 in 1974, a decrease of 15.0 percent.

MATERNAL MORTALITY: In 1974 there were 16 maternal deaths to residents of New Jersey, the same as in 1973. Expressed per 10,000 live births the maternal mortality rate was 1.7, also the same as in 1973. Maternal mortality has continually decreased. In 1954 there were 59 maternal deaths. In 1964 there were 48 maternal deaths. The maternal mortality rates in these years were 5.0 and 3.9 respectively. Nationwide there were an estimated 660 maternal deaths with a mortality rate of 2.1 per 10,000 live births.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF DEATH: The five leading causes of death in 1974 were 1) diseases of the heart 2) malignant neoplasms 3) cerebrovascular diseases 4) accidents

and 5) influenza and pneumonia, the same as those reported for 1973. In 1973 there were 68,605 resident deaths producing a mortality rate of 927.6 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. In 1974 there were 1,877 fewer deaths resulting in a mortality rate of 900.1. The five leading causes of death accounted for 79.4 percent of all resident deaths. The decrease in deaths due to these five causes accounted for 88.0 percent of the total decrease in deaths. There were 29,167 deaths attributed to diseases of the heart in 1973 as compared with 28,160 such deaths in 1974, a decrease of 3.5 percent. The mortality rate dropped from 394.3 to 379.8 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. Malignant neoplasms, the second leading killer in New Jersey, claimed the lives of 13,999 residents in 1974, a decrease of 0.6 percent over the reported 14,077 deaths in 1973. The mortality rate of 188.8 represented only a slight decrease from the rate of 190.3 reported in 1973. Cerebrovascular diseases resulted in 6,351 deaths in 1974, with a mortality rate of 85.7, as compared with 6,499 deaths due to this cause in 1973 with a rate of 87.9. There were 8.9 percent fewer deaths caused by accidents in 1974, and 8.1 percent fewer deaths attributed to influenza and pneumonia, producing mortality rates of 36.8 and 23.5 deaths per 100,000 estimated population, respectively.

There were 291 deaths of children aged 1-4 in 1974 as compared to 314 deaths in this age group in 1973, a decrease of 7.3 percent. Accidents accounted for 107 of these deaths.

There was a reduction of 17.4 percent in the number of deaths of children aged 5-14, with a 20.9 percent reduction in the number of accidental deaths in this age group. In 1973 there were 455 total deaths of children aged 5-14 resulting in an estimated age-specific mortality rate of 31.4 deaths per 100,000, while in 1974 there were only 376 such deaths with a mortality rate of 25.9. A total of 215 children in this age group died of accidents in 1973, while only 170 accidental deaths were reported in 1974, although accidents remained the number one cause of death in this age group.

There were 1,239 deaths in the age-group 15-24 with an estimated age specific mortality rate of 106.8. In 1973, a total of 1,296 persons aged 15-24 died producing a rate of 112.0. The five leading causes of death in this age group remained 1) accidents, 2) homicides and legal intervention, 3) malignant neoplasms, 4) suicide and 5) influenza and pneumonia. There were 8.9 percent fewer deaths due to accidents, and 13.6 percent fewer deaths due to homicide in 1974 as compared with 1973, accounting for the bulk of the decrease in deaths in this age group.

The age-specific mortality rate of persons aged 25-44 decreased from 192.3 in 1973, to 183.2 in 1974 based on 3,464 and 3,308 deaths, respectively. Deaths due to malignant neoplasms, the leading cause of death in this age group, decreased 6.6 percent. Deaths due to diseases of the heart, and accidents, the 2nd and 3rd leading causes of death, decreased 6.2 and 6.9 percent respectively. There were 633 deaths caused by malignant neoplasms, 586 deaths attributed to diseases of the heart, and 567 deaths caused by accidents, resulting in respective age-specific mortality rates of 35.0, 32.4 and 31.4.

The number of deaths in the age-groups 45 to 64, and 65 and older each decreased slightly resulting in somewhat lower age-specific mortality rates

than were recorded in 1973. In 1974 there were 16,825 deaths of persons aged 45-64 producing an estimated age-specific rate of 1,009.0. In 1973 there were 17,413 deaths in this age group with a mortality rate of 1,046.8. A total of 43,176 persons aged 65 and older died in 1974, compared with 44,045 deaths the previous year. The age-specific rate in 1974 was 5,993.7, while in 1973 the rate was 6,128.7 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. There were 2.2 percent fewer heart disease deaths among persons aged 45-64 in 1974 as compared with 1973, resulting in an age-disease specific rate of 396.2. The second leading cause of death in this age group, malignant neoplasms, resulted in 5,161 deaths (2.6 percent fewer than 1973) with a mortality rate of 309.5. Each of the other leading causes of death in this age group showed fewer deaths with the exception of diabetes mellitus deaths which increased 5.7 percent. There was a reduction of 3.7 percent in the number of deaths attributed to diseases of the heart, in those 65 and older, resulting in an age-specific rate of 2,905.6 per 100,000. Deaths due to malignant neoplasms among the elderly increased 1.7 percent producing a rate of 1,114.0 as compared with the 1973 rate of 1,097.9. All other leading causes of death of the elderly resulted in fewer deaths, with the exception of cirrhosis of the liver. In 1973 there were 328 such deaths while in 1974 391 elderly persons died of this disease, an increase of 19.2 percent. The comparative mortality rates were 45.6 and 54.3 respectively.

MAJOR CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES: Major cardiovascular diseases include 1) diseases of the heart, 2) hypertension, 3) cerebrovascular disease, 4) arteriosclerosis, and 5) other diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries. In 1974 there were 36,332 deaths attributed to major cardiovascular diseases resulting in a mortality rate of 490.1 per 100,000 estimated population. In 1973 there were 37,549 deaths producing a rate of 507.7. The mortality rates were somewhat lower for the United States. In 1973 there were an estimated 1,037,492 deaths, while in 1974 1,017,350 persons were estimated to have died from this disease, resulting in respective rates of 494.4 and 481.3.

Diseases of the heart remain the principal cause of death among residents of New Jersey irrespective of race and sex. There were 28,160 resident deaths in 1974 producing a rate of 379.8. Mortality was higher among males than females, and among whites when compared to nonwhites. There were 15,344 male deaths and 12,816 female deaths resulting in mortality rates of 427.9 and 334.8. Among whites there were 26,075 deaths with a mortality rate of 397.0 while the 2,085 nonwhite deaths due to heart disease produced a rate of 246.5. As would be expected, the mortality rate of white males (446.6) far exceeded that for nonwhite males (278.8), and the mortality rate for white females (350.3) exceeded that for nonwhite females (217.5). Diseases of the heart caused the greatest number of deaths among white males 25 years of age and older. Among white females, diseases of the heart was the leading cause of death of those aged 65 and older, and the second leading cause of death of those aged 25-64. Among the nonwhite population, diseases of the heart was the principal cause of death for those 45 years of age and older, and the second leading cause of death of those aged 25-44, irregardless of sex. Throughout the United States

there were 746,480 deaths attributed to diseases of the heart producing a rate of 353.1. As was the case in New Jersey, the 1974 rate represents a decrease from the rate of 360.8 reported in 1973 based on 757,075 deaths.

Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death among white males, white females, and nonwhite females, and the fourth leading cause of death of nonwhite males. There were 2,376 white male deaths in 1974 as compared with 2,568 deaths in 1973, resulting in rates of 74.6 and 80.8 respectively. In 1973 there were 272 nonwhite male deaths with a mortality rate of 68.1, while in 1974 the 276 nonwhite male deaths produced a rate of 68.9. Among white females there were 3,379 deaths in 1974 and 3,305 deaths in 1973, resulting in mortality rates of 99.9 and 97.9 respectively. There were 354 nonwhite female deaths in 1973 and 320 deaths in 1974 producing rates of 79.6 and 71.8 respectively. Thus the mortality rates decreased for white males and nonwhite females, and increased for white females and nonwhite males. The mortality rate overall (85.7) based on 6,351 deaths attributed to cerebrovascular disease represents a decrease from that reported in 1973 (87.9) based on 6,499 deaths, and remains considerably lower than that reported for the United States (97.2). Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death of persons 45 years of age and older.

There were 749 deaths in 1974 due to arteriosclerosis as compared with 795 such deaths in 1973, a decrease of 5.8 percent. There were 288 white male deaths, 424 white female deaths, 23 nonwhite male deaths and 14 nonwhite female deaths. The corresponding mortality rates were 9.0, 12.5, 5.7 and 3.1 respectively. Thus, white female mortality was higher than male mortality, and nonwhite male mortality was higher than nonwhite female mortality, with white mortality overall, higher than nonwhite mortality due to this disease condition. There were 32,050 deaths throughout the United States attributed to arteriosclerosis with a mortality rate of 15.2 per 100,000 estimated population, considerably higher than the rate of 10.1, overall, for New Jersey residents. Deaths due to this disease generally occur in older persons, as evidenced by the fact that 702 of the resident deaths (93.7 percent) attributed to this disease in New Jersey, were persons 65 years of age and older.

There were 871 deaths due to diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries, the same number as reported for 1973, with 658 deaths (75.5%) occurring in those 65 years of age and older. The mortality rate in 1974 was 11.7 per 100,000 estimated population, compared with the United States rate of 12.4. Mortality is higher among whites than nonwhites and among males as compared with females. There were 518 white male deaths and 27 nonwhite male deaths caused by diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries producing mortality rates of 16.3 and 6.7 respectively. There were 295 white female deaths compared to 31 nonwhite female deaths resulting in mortality rates of 8.7 and 7.0 respectively.

Hypertension was responsible for 201 deaths in 1974 a reduction of 7.4 percent from the number reported in 1973, producing a rate of 2.7 per 100,000. The United States mortality rate was 3.4 based on 7,150 estimated deaths. There were 172 white and 29 nonwhite deaths caused by hypertension resulting in race-specific mortality rates of 2.6 and 3.4, respectively, with no apparent sex related differences in mortality rates.

CANCER: During 1974 there were 13,999 deaths due to malignant neoplasms producing a mortality rate of 188.8 per 100,000 estimated population, slightly lower than the 1973 rate of 190.3, but still considerably higher than the United States mortality rate of 169.5. There were 6,822 white males who died from cancer and 708 nonwhite males, resulting in mortality rates of 214.1 and 176.9. Cancer claimed the lives of 5,957 white females and 512 nonwhite females producing mortality rates of 176.1 and 114.9. Malignant neoplasms were the second leading cause of death of persons over 45 years of age irrespective of race or age, the second leading cause of death among white and nonwhite females between the ages of 25 and 44, and the second leading cause of death among white males and females aged 5-14. The white and nonwhite male mortality rates for 1974 represent slight increases over the rates of 213.9 and 171.5 reported in 1973. The white and nonwhite female mortality rates for 1974 represent slight decreases over the rates of 179.2 and 123.3 reported in 1973.

Cancer of the buccal cavity and pharynx was nearly three times greater among males than females. There were 243 deaths among males and 97 deaths among females producing sex-specific rates of 6.8 and 2.5 respectively. Similarly cancer of the respiratory system resulted in 2,431 deaths to men, with a male mortality rate of 67.8, and 686 deaths of women, with a female mortality rate of 17.9. With some obvious exceptions cancer mortality rates by anatomical site were higher among men.

Specific cancer sites with the highest mortality include cancer of the trachea, bronchus and lung (2,931 deaths), cancer of the large intestine (1,798 deaths), breast cancer (1,366 deaths), cancer of the pancreas (726 deaths), stomach cancer (723 deaths), and cancer of the prostate (642 deaths). Cancer of the trachea, bronchus and lung caused the deaths of 2,286 men and 645 women with sex-specific rates of 63.7 and 16.9 respectively. The overall mortality rate was 39.5. The mortality rate for cancer of the large intestine was 24.3, with sex-specific rates of 24.1 and 24.4 based on 863 and 935 female deaths. The breast cancer rate for women was 35.3

based on 1,351 deaths. The pancreatic cancer mortality rate for men was 10.8 (388 deaths) and for women 8.8 (338 deaths) with an overall rate of 9.8. More men died of stomach cancer than women, producing sex-specific rates of 12.0 and 7.7 deaths per 100,000 estimated population, with an overall mortality rate for both sexes of 9.8. There were 17.9 deaths per 100,000 men due to cancer of the prostate.

ACCIDENTS: Accidents were the fourth leading cause of death of residents of New Jersey in 1974, irregardless of race or sex. There were 2,728 deaths in 1974, compared with 2,994 in 1973, a decrease of 8.9 percent. The 1974 mortality rate was 36.8 per 100,000 estimated population compared with the 1973 rate of 40.5 and the United States mortality rate of 48.9. There were 1,496 deaths among white males and 347 deaths among nonwhite males producing mortality rates of 47.0 and 86.7 respectively. Mortality rates among females were considerably lower as 760 white female deaths and 125 nonwhite female deaths produced rates of 22.5 and 28.1 respectively. Accidents were the leading cause of deaths of persons under 25 years of age, excluding infants, and the third leading cause of deaths of persons aged 25-44.

Motor vehicle accidents claimed the lives of 1,120 residents in 1974, compared with 1,300 residents in 1973. The result was a decrease in the mortality rate from 18.0 in 1973 to 15.1 deaths per 100,000 population, in 1974. There were 337 motor vehicle deaths of persons aged 15-24 (30.1% of total) and 290 deaths of persons aged 25-44 (25.9% of total). There were an estimated 45,060 motor vehicle fatalities throughout the United States in 1974 producing a rate of 21.3.

Other accidental deaths include deaths from falls (572), poisonings (294), and fires (185). Sixty-nine percent (393) deaths from falls involved persons 65 and older, while fifty percent (146) of all poisoning tragedies involved young people between the ages of 15 and 24. Deaths from poisoning increased 38.0 percent over the reported figure (213) for 1973, and deaths of persons aged 15-24 attributed to poisonings increased 50.5 percent.

INFLUENZA AND PNEUMONIA: There were 1,705 deaths due to pneumonia the fifth leading cause of death of New Jersey residents, and an additional 40 deaths caused by influenza, in 1974. In 1973, a total of 1,837 persons died of pneumonia while 61 others died from influenza. The mortality rate for these two causes combined was 23.5 per 100,000 in 1974 compared to a rate of 25.7 in 1973. The United States mortality rate for 1974 was 25.7. Pneumonia caused the deaths of 72 infants under one year of age making it the third leading cause of death in this age group. However, 69.1 percent of all deaths due to influenza and pneumonia combined (1,205) were involved persons aged 65 or older. There were 830 deaths of white males (26.1 per 100,000) and 728 white female deaths (21.5 per 100,000), while 115 nonwhite males died of these causes (28.7 per 100,000), and 72 nonwhite females (16.2 per 100,000) died. The mortality rates for nonwhite males and females represent considerable decreases from the rates of 39.1 and 22.3 reported in 1973.

DIABETES MELLITUS: There were 1,449 deaths attributed to diabetes in 1974 compared with 1,535 deaths in 1973, a decrease of 5.6 percent. Diabetes remained the sixth leading cause of death of New Jersey residents; the seventh leading cause of death in the male population with 598 deaths reported; and the fifth leading cause of female mortality with 851 deaths reported. The overall mortality rate in 1974 was 19.5 compared to a rate of 20.8 in 1973. The male mortality rates for 1973 and 1974 were 17.9 and 16.7 respectively, while the female mortality rate decreased from 23.4 in 1973 to 22.2 in 1974. The white male mortality rate was 17.0 per 100,000 based on 541 deaths, as compared to the nonwhite male mortality rate of 14.2 based on only 57 reported fatalities. By contrast the nonwhite female mortality rate of 26.0 resulting from 116 deaths was higher than the white female mortality rate of 21.7 based on 735 deaths. The mortality rate from diabetes mellitus has showed yearly fluctuations but in general has remained basically unchanged over the last 25 years. The United States mortality rate (17.4) remained somewhat lower than the figure for New Jersey.

HOMICIDE: After a continuous upward trend in the numbers of deaths and the mortality rates from homicide since 1963, 1974 saw a leveling off. There were, in fact, 10 fewer deaths in 1974, and a drop in the mortality rate from 7.1 to 6.9 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. Still, homicide remained the second leading cause of death of persons aged 15-24 with 127 such deaths reported (10.9 per 100,000), and the fifth leading cause of death of persons aged 25-44, with 218 deaths (12.1 per 100,000). There were 185 white male deaths (5.8 per 100,000), and 79 white female deaths (2.3 per 100,000). Homicide claimed the lives of 201 nonwhite males (50.2 per 100,000) and 48 nonwhite females (10.8 per 100,000). Homicide was the leading cause of death of nonwhite males aged 25-44, and the second leading cause of death among nonwhite males aged 15-24.

There were 92 homicide deaths of nonwhite males aged 25-44 (91.8 per 100,000) and 59 homicide deaths (84.3 per 100,000) of nonwhite males aged 15-24. Nearly one out of every five deaths of nonwhite males between the ages of 15-44 was the result of homicide. The United States mortality rate of 9.8 in 1974 remained unchanged from that reported for the previous year.

SUICIDE: There were 572 suicides involving New Jersey residents in 1974, and 609 such deaths the previous year. The mortality rate for 1974 was 7.7 deaths per 100,000 estimated population. Mortality rates were nearly twice as high among whites when compared to nonwhites, and more than twice as high among men. There were 371 white male suicides (11.6 per 100,000) and 165 white female suicides (4.9 per 100,000), 27 nonwhite male suicides (6.7 per 100,000) and 9 nonwhite female suicides (2.0 per 100,000). Suicide mortality rates increased with age. There were 86 suicides of persons aged 15-24, 175 suicides involving persons aged 25-44, 200 in the age group 45-64, and 104 suicides of persons aged 65 and older. The age-specific rates were 7.4, 9.7, 12.0 and 14.4. The age-specific rate for persons aged 15-24 represents a slight increase over the rate reported in 1970 (7.0), while the other rates each represent decreases. The rate for those aged 65 and

older represented the most dramatic decrease. In 1973 there were 136 reported suicides in this age group with an age-specific rate of 18.9.

Interestingly, New Jersey, which has experienced a high unemployment rate combined with inflation, showed a decrease in suicide mortality, while the United States mortality rate rose from 12.0 to 12.5 deaths per 100,000 in 1974.

OTHER SELECTED CAUSES OF DEATH: Cirrhosis of the liver was responsible for the deaths of 1,346 New Jersey residents in 1974, and was the seventh leading cause of death. The mortality rate for 1974 was 18.2, while in 1973 there were 1,400 deaths resulting in a rate of 18.9. Mortality rates were higher among men than women, and higher in nonwhites. The mortality rate for white males was 22.7 (722 deaths), and for white females, 11.9 (402 deaths), while 132 nonwhite male deaths, and 90 nonwhite female deaths produced rates of 33.0 and 20.2 respectively.

There were 735 deaths due to bronchitis, asthma, and emphysema combined (9.9 per 100,000), 277 deaths due to nephritis and nephrosis (3.7 per 100,000), 200 deaths resulting from hernia and intestinal obstruction (2.7 per 100,000), 167 deaths caused by infections of the kidney (2.3 per 100,000), 191 deaths from septicemia (2.6 per 100,000), and 161 deaths attributed to tuberculosis (all forms).

NOTIFIABLE DISEASE MORBIDITY: Syphilis and gonorrhea have in the past, and remain today, two of the most pressing health problems in New Jersey as well as throughout the United States. In 1973 there were 2,895 cases of syphilis and 16,206 cases of gonorrhea reported in the civilian population resulting in morbidity rates of 39.3 and 219.8 respectively. A 9.0 percent decrease in reported cases of syphilis (2,634) produced a morbidity rate of 35.5 per 100,000 estimated population. A 5.6 percent decrease in reported cases of gonorrhea (15,294) resulted in a morbidity rate of 206.3. There were 26 additional cases of syphilis and 716 additional cases of gonorrhea reported by the military; thus resulting in a total of 2,660 resident cases of syphilis and 16,010 resident cases of gonorrhea reported, with overall rates of 35.9 and 216.0. Of the total cases of syphilis 1,507 were men, and 1,153 were women, resulting in sex-specific rates of 42.0 and 30.1 respectively. The male morbidity rate for gonorrhea was 273.5 based on 9,808 cases, and 162.0 for women, based on 6,202 cases. All sex-specific rates represent decreases from those reported in 1973. There were 849 cases of primary and secondary syphilis reported in 1974 (11.5 per 100,000) compared to 1,026 cases in 1973 (13.9 per 100,000). In 1973 687 cases of early latent syphilis were reported, compared to 628 cases in 1974, resulting in rates of 9.3 and 8.5 respectively. A total of 1,148 cases of late or late latent syphilis produced a rate of 15.5 in 1974, while in 1973 1,187 cases were reported (16.0 per 100,000). In addition, in 1974 35 cases of congenital syphilis were reported. The highest age-specific rate for all cases of syphilis, 99.8 cases per 100,000 residents aged 20-24, was based on 526 cases reported. In 1973 there were 639 cases reported with a morbidity rate of 121.5. Incidence of gonorrhea was also highest in the age group 20-24, as 5,998 cases

resulted in a morbidity rate of 1,137.7 cases per 100,000 persons. There were an additional 4,888 cases reported among persons 15-19 years of age, with a rate of 772.7. In 1973, 6,128 cases among those aged 20-24 produced a rate of 1,165.1, while 4,712 cases among persons aged 15-19 produced a rate of 746.6. The United States morbidity rate for newly reported cases of syphilis, all stages, for 1974 was 39.9, slightly higher than New Jersey's rate, while for gonorrhea a rate of 428.7 was reported, almost twice as high as that of New Jersey.

Tuberculosis morbidity and mortality trends have been in a downward trend for the past 20 years. In 1974 there were 1,474 new cases of tuberculosis reported as compared with 1,531 cases in 1973, a decrease of 3.7 percent. The morbidity dropped from 20.8 to 19.9. There were 161 deaths due to tuberculosis compared with 184 in 1973, resulting in morbidity rates of 2.5 and 2.2, respectively. Morbidity was higher in males than females, and, in general, increased with age. A total of 940 cases among men and 534 among women produced rates of 26.2 and 14.0 cases per 100,000 estimated population. There were 259 cases in the population 65 years of age and older (36.0 per 100,000), of which 171 were men (58.0 cases per 100,000 men aged 65+).

Hepatitis was classified into three separate categories in 1974, serum hepatitis, infectious hepatitis and hepatitis unspecified. There were 846 cases of serum hepatitis, 922 cases of infectious hepatitis, and 299 cases of hepatitis unspecified, with morbidity rates of 11.4, 12.4 and 4.0 respectively. In 1973 all cases of hepatitis were classified as either serum or infectious hepatitis. A total of 503 cases were classified as serum hepatitis, while 1,179 were classified as infectious. In 1974 morbidity was higher among men in each of the three categories of classification. There were 515 cases of serum hepatitis in the male population and 331 cases in the female population producing morbidity rates of 6.9 and 4.5 respectively. The male infectious hepatitis morbidity rate was 7.5 (553 cases) compared to the female rate of 5.0 cases per 100,000 estimated population (369 cases reported). For hepatitis unspecified there were 160 and 139 male and female cases reported, respectively, with morbidity rates of 2.2 and 1.9. Hepatitis was most prevalent among those aged 20-24. A total of 250 serum hepatitis cases (47.4 per 100,000), 222 infectious hepatitis (42.1 per 100,000) and 65 cases of hepatitis unknown (12.3 per 100,000 estimated population) were reported in this age group.

There were 5,693 cases of measles (rubeola) in 1974 compared with 774 cases reported in 1973. Of the total reported in 1974, 44.9 percent occurred in Bergen County (2,558), 12.2 percent (696) in Passaic County, 7.0 percent (401) in Essex County, 6.8 percent (385) in Middlesex County, 5.3 percent (300) in Hudson County and 5.0 percent (283) in Union County. Thus, while the outbreak was widespread, 81.2 percent of cases occurred in the north-eastern part of the state.

There were 465 cases of rubella (German measles) in 1974 compared to over 3,000 in 1973. There were 784 cases of mumps, less than half of the number occurring in 1973. There were 1,162 cases of salmonellosis, an increase of 7.6 percent; 454 cases of shigellosis, a decrease of 17.5 percent, 151 cases of aseptic meningitis, a decrease of 41.2 percent, and 94 cases of amebiasis, an increase of 70.9 percent.

APPENDIX A

Glossary of Terms

AGE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of persons of a given age group per 100,000 estimated persons in that age group usually expressed as an annual rate.

CAUSE GROUP - a summary of deaths resulting from, or cases of, related diseases as defined by the International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States, published by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; usually specified by a series of 3-digit codes i.e. 140-209 - malignant neoplasms.

CAUSE-3 DIGIT - the cause of death or morbidity as defined by a 3-digit code in the International List. Disease conditions are also further classified and so specified, by the addition of a decimal point and a fourth digit. For example, the three digit code "140" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lip, and the four digit code "140.1" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lower lip.

ESTIMATED POPULATION - the estimated number of persons in a given group based on the latest census data and adjusted for annual births, annual deaths and net migration.

FETAL DEATH - a death prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy also known as a stillbirth. The death of an infant that has breathed or shown other evidence of life, no matter for how short a period, should be reported as a live birth and an infant death.

FETAL DEATH RATES - the number of fetal deaths occurring in the twentieth week of gestation or later (required by law to be registered as fetal deaths) per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

FERTILITY RATE - the number of live births to women aged 15-44 per 1,000 women in this age group, usually expressed as an annual rate.

ILLEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to an unwed mother, or to a mother whose husband did not father the infant.

ILLEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to an unwed mother, or a mother whose husband did not father the fetus.

INFANT DEATH - the death of a baby under one year of age, no matter how short a period of time the baby breathed or shown other evidence of life.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE - the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

INTERNATIONAL LIST - a listing of disease classifications known as the "International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States", published by the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, used in the statistical coding and tabulation of specific disease morbidity and mortality.

LEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to a married woman whose husband fathered the infant.

LEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to a married woman whose husband fathered the fetus.

MATERNAL DEATH - a death of a woman occurring during the period of pregnancy or following delivery of the infant and related to the pregnancy or delivery of the infant.

MATERNAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

MORBIDITY - the relative incidence (number of cases) of disease, usually used with respect to specific disease conditions i.e. tuberculosis morbidity refers to the number of cases of tuberculosis.

MORTALITY - the number of deaths.

NEONATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the newborn and especially the human infant during the first month of life.

NEONATAL MORTALITY RATE - as used in this text, the number of deaths of infants under 28 days of age per 1,000 live births, per year.

NET MIGRATION - the difference in population resulting from persons attaining residency status, and persons dropping residency status, often referred to as in-migration and out-migration, respectively.

PERINATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the fetus and the newborn, especially the human infant during the first ~~week~~ ^{month} of life.

28 PERINATAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of infants less than ~~seven~~ days of age, and registered fetal deaths per 1,000 live births plus registered fetal deaths. *Fetal + Neonatal Deaths*

RACE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths in a given ethnic group per 100,000 estimated population in that ethnic group.

SELECTED PLACES - as used in this report, cities, townships and municipalities with a population of 45,000 or more as of the 1970 census.

SEX-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of males/females per 100,000 estimated males/females in the population.
