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**Report of the Public Health Statistics Program
Calendar Year, 1975**

INTRODUCTION: The annual report of the Public Health Statistics Program for 1975 contains a summary of basic information regarding births, marriages, deaths, fetal deaths, disease morbidity and population, for the calendar year. Some additional detailed vital statistics data is available, but is not included in this publication due to size limitations. Some information can be obtained by contacting the Public Health Statistics Program directly.

Vital events data were tabulated from birth, marriage, death, and fetal death certificates filed with the State Registrar prior to May 1, 1976. In September 1976 additional reports of infant and fetal deaths involving, for the most part, Newark residents, during the years 1973, 1974 and 1975 were received by the State Registrar. All tabulations, including those for 1973 and 1974 were corrected to reflect this additional information. Birth rates, death rates, and fetal death rates are based on a tabulation of events occurring to residents of New Jersey, unless otherwise stated. Included in these tabulations are events involving residents of New Jersey irrespective of place of occurrence, and thus include events occurring out-of-state. Through a reciprocal arrangement between states, copies of birth, death and fetal death certificates (to be used for statistical purposes only) are interchanged, making a complete tabulation of resident information possible. Copies of marriage certificates are not interchanged between states. Marriage rates, as computed in this report are by place of occurrence rather than place of residence.

The Tuberculosis Services Program provided the tuberculosis morbidity data included in this report, while the Venereal Disease Control Program, which is responsible for the collection of confidential reports of syphilis and gonorrhea submitted data with respect to these diseases. Also included in this report is data generated by the Communicable Disease Control Program regarding other reportable diseases.

The Office of Business Economics, Department of Labor and Industry, was given the responsibility of providing annual estimates of the population of New Jersey and its 567 municipalities. These estimates are periodically revised to reflect the latest information available with respect to births, deaths and migration. The population estimates published on December 15, 1975 by that program were used in preparing the birth, marriage, mortality and morbidity rates appearing in this report. Natality, mortality, and morbidity rates have been adjusted for 1974 to reflect the latest population estimates appearing in that report. The rates for 1975 as presented in this report are provisional, and subject to change based on forthcoming revised population estimates. The Office of Business Economics also provided an estimate of the population breakdown by age, race, and sex for total New Jersey, and each county.

Included in the appendix to this report is a table presenting provisional mortality rates for 1974 and 1975 for the United States by selected cause groups by age. This table was prepared by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, Health Resources Administration, National Center for Health Statistics and appears, as is, in the Monthly Vital Statistics Report, Annual Summary for 1975. Their cooperation in allowing us to reproduce this table is appreciated.

The joint efforts of personnel of the above mentioned programs and those of the Public Health Statistics Program, Data Processing and Graphic Arts Services made this report possible.

POPULATION: The provisional population estimate of New Jersey for July 1, 1975 was 7,433,920, an increase of 0.33 percent over the revised population estimate of 7,408,955 for July 1, 1974. Atlantic and Essex Counties showed slight decreases in population while all other counties showed slight increases. The population in New Jersey has increased continuously since 1944. However, the rate of increase for the 1974-1975 period is estimated to be the smallest for the 32 year period. There were 93,267 resident births and 65,683 resident deaths during the period July 1, 1974 through June 30, 1975, resulting in a natural increase of 27,584. However, 2,619 more people are estimated to have left New Jersey than came to New Jersey resulting in total net change in population size of 24,965. Based on final population estimates for July 1, 1973 and July 1, 1974 the net migration factor was +12,035, while the previous years net migration was estimated as +21,720. The estimated increasing migration out of New Jersey is consistent with the persistent high rate of unemployment in New Jersey over the past three years.

New Jersey covers a land area of 7,521 square miles. The latest provisional population estimate produces a population density of 988.4 persons per square mile. In 1970 the population density of New Jersey was exceeded only by that of the District of Columbia.

The latest estimate of the United States resident population for July 1, 1975 published by the Census Bureau in August, 1976, was 213,032,000. This estimate represents an increase of 0.78 percent over the estimated population of 211,389,000 for the previous year. Since the April, 1970 census of the United States, the population is estimated to have increased 4.8 percent. By contrast, New Jersey's population is estimated to have increased 3.7 percent over that same period.

VITAL EVENTS IN NEW JERSEY: During 1975 there were 89,041 births which took place in New Jersey compared with 91,852 births in 1974, a decrease of 3.1 percent. These figures include births to residents as well as nonresidents. A total of 88,864 births occurred in hospitals of which 393 (0.44%) were delivered by registered nurses. In 1974 91,624 births took place in hospitals, with registered nurses delivering 297 infants (0.32%). Of the total of 177 births occurring outside of hospitals in 1975, 84 occurred in homes while 93 occurred elsewhere. Midwives delivered 7 infants in 1975. Most births occurred during the months of July and August (7,959 and 7,911 respectively) and fewest occurred in November (6,806). On the average there were 244 births occurring each day in New Jersey.

A total of 64,083 persons died in New Jersey in 1975 compared with a corrected total of 65,851 in 1974, a decrease of 2.7 percent. There were more deaths per day in February (197) than in any other month and fewer deaths per day in September and October (165 and 167 respectively). The most dramatic monthly change occurred in March. In 1975 there were 5,720 deaths in this month, while one year earlier there were 6,241 deaths, representing a decrease of 8.3 percent.

RESIDENT BIRTHS: During 1975 there were 91,457 resident births in New Jersey, the lowest figure since 1944, while the resulting birth rate of 12.3 represented the lowest recorded birth rate in New Jersey history, dating back to 1879. A total of 91,101 infants were born to women aged 15-44 resulting in a fertility rate of 56.6 per 1,000 women. During 1974 there were 94,242 births of which 93,882 were to women aged 15-44. The birth rate was 12.7 while the fertility rate was 61.6.

Information on race was again very poor in 1975. A reported 71,579 births occurred to white mothers while 18,248 nonwhite births took place. A total of 1,630 births were recorded with no information as to race. In 1974 there were 74,131 reported white births so that it is clear that the actual number of white births has declined, irrespective of the true classification of births for which race was unreported. The number of births reported as being nonwhite in 1974 was 18,485. Because of the large number of births unknown as to race it is impossible to determine whether the true number of nonwhite births has declined or not. Since racial information was not given on nearly two percent of all birth certificates, race-specific birth, infant death, and fetal death rates have not been computed and do not appear in this publication.

Provisional data for 1975 indicate a total of 3,149,000 births took place in the United States producing a birth rate of 14.8. Final data for 1974 show a total of 3,159,958 births with a rate of 14.9. The decrease of less than one percent resulted in a decline in the United States fertility rate from 68.4 to 66.7 births per 1,000 women aged 15-44. The National Center For Health Statistics which reported this data (HRA 76-1120 Vol. 24, No. 13, June 30, 1976) cited Census Bureau estimates indicating a two percent increase in the number of women of childbearing age during this time period, and projections of another ten percent increase by 1980. Should Census Bureau projections hold true, the number of births and the birth rate should begin to increase, unless dramatic decreases in the fertility rates (especially for women aged 20-29) are seen.

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY LEGITIMACY: In New Jersey, an illegitimate birth is defined as a birth to a woman who is not married, or a birth to a married woman whose husband did not father the child. An item on the New Jersey birth certificate requires an answer to the following: "Legitimate Yes No ". Tabulations are based on the answer given. The terms legitimate and illegitimate are used in this report in accordance with the above definition for lack or more convenient terminology.

The percentage of illegitimate births occurring in New Jersey has continuously increased since 1970. In 1970 there were 13,098 while in 1971 there were 12,874. These figures represented 10.9 and 11.6 percent respectively, of total births for those years. In 1972, 1973 and 1974 there were 12,805, 13,526, and 13,825 illegitimate births representing 12.9, 14.4, and 14.7 percent of total births. In 1975 there were 14,333 illegitimate births (15.7 percent of all births). Since 1970 the number of births has decreased 23.9 percent, while the number of illegitimate births has increased 9.4 percent. Of the total of 71,577 births reported as white, 7.4 percent were classified as illegitimate. Of the 18,248 nonwhite births reported 49.5 percent were classified as illegitimate. Most certificates without racial information, were classified as legitimate births, and complete racial information would tend to lower the percentage of illegitimate births by race, although not appreciably. In 1974, 6.2 percent of births classified as white were illegitimate, while 48.1 percent of births classified as nonwhite were illegitimate. A total of 6,705 illegitimate births (46.8 percent of illegitimate births) were to mothers under 20 years of age. In 1974 6,503 illegitimate births involved teenage mothers (47.0 percent of total illegitimate births).

RESIDENT BIRTHS BY BIRTH WEIGHT: In 1975 all but 1,733 birth certificates had information as to birth weight. Of these 6,973 (7.8 percent) were births classified as immature (2500 grams or less). The percentage of low birth weight infants has remained the same since 1973. A total of 4,555 white births were under 2500 grams (6.4 percent) while 2,415 nonwhite births were in this low weight group (13.2 percent). The percentage of low weight white births increased slightly (6.2 percent in 1974), while the percentage of low weight nonwhite births decreased (13.7 percent in 1974). Of the reported 12,566 births to teenage mothers 1,478 were 2500 grams or less (11.8 percent). There were 1,990 births of low birth weight classified as illegitimate (13.9 percent of illegitimate births). Illegitimate teenage pregnancies resulted in the delivery of 962 infants of low birth weight (14.3 percent of all teenage illegitimate births).

MARRIAGES: During the early 1950's the marriage rate in New Jersey dropped dramatically, from 9.6 marriages per 1,000 people in 1950 to 6.5 marriages per 1,000 people in 1959. During the 1960's and early 1970's the trend reversed, with more people marrying. By 1973 there were 8.1 marriages performed per 1,000 people living in New Jersey. In 1974 there were 5.5 percent fewer marriages than in the previous year (56,449 as compared with 59,723 in 1973), resulting in a rate of 7.6. In 1975 there were only 53,008 marriages performed, a decrease of 6.1 percent producing a rate of 7.1.

The downward trend in 1974 and 1975 reflects the nationwide experience. In 1974 marriage rates declined in all but nine states. In 1975 rates declined in all but seven states (Alaska, Colorado, North Dakota, Washington,

Kentucky, Arizona, and Idaho. Provisional data for the United States indicate that 2,126,000 marriages were performed in 1975 producing a rate of 10.0 per 1,000 population. The lowest rates were reported in the Northeast Region, with higher rates reported in the North Central Region, and the highest rates reported in the South and West Regions.

Most marriages occurred during June and August, while fewer marriages were performed in New Jersey during the winter months of December, January, February and March.

A certain trend has become apparent over the past three years 1973-1975. There has been a significant decrease in the number of single people (never previously married) going to the altar. By contrast, more marriages are being performed which involve at least one previously married person. The first phenomenon might reflect, although no positive proof is available, a change in attitude towards the institution of marriage by the so-called younger generation. The second phenomenon might be due to a liberalization of divorce laws. With substantially more divorces taking place, it is likely that more marriages involving at least one divorced person will occur. In 1973 there were 94,558 persons marrying for the first time. In 1974 88,107 persons married for the first time, a decrease of 6.8 percent. In 1975 81,278 persons married for the first time, a decrease of 7.8 percent. In 1973 46,691 men were married for the first time, while in 1974 43,353 men married for the first time, a decrease of 7.1 percent. In 1975 only 39,953 men with no previous marital history married for the first time, a decrease of 7.8 percent. Women followed a similar pattern with 47,867 marrying for the first time in 1973, 44,754 doing so in 1974 (a decrease of 6.5 percent) and only 41,325 doing so in 1975 (a decrease of 7.7 percent).

By contrast there were 19,346 persons remarrying in 1973, 19,624 remarrying in 1974 (an increase of 1.4 percent) and 19,881 remarrying in 1975 (an increase of 1.3 percent).

A further evidence of changes in patterns regarding marriage is reflected in the average age at marriage which has steadily increased. In 1968 the average age of a bridegroom was 27.6 years, while the average age of brides was 25.0. In 1975 bridegrooms averaged 28.8 years of age while brides averaged 26.1 years of age. While no data is available on the age at first marriage, data is available which shows a decrease in the number of teenagers marrying, which might indicate that the average age of first marriages has probably increased. In 1973 there were 5,083 teenage grooms, while in 1974 there were only 4,456 teenage grooms, a decrease of 12.3 percent. In 1975 there were only 3,763 teenage grooms, a decrease of 15.6 percent. In 1973 13,290 teenage girls married while in 1974 11,882 were wed, a decrease of 10.6 percent. A further decline occurred in 1975 as only 10,250 marriages involved a teenage bride, a decrease of 13.7 percent.

RESIDENT DEATHS: The number of resident deaths in New Jersey has gradually declined each year since 1972 when 68,865 deaths were reported (9.4 per 1,000). In 1973 and 1974 there were 68,631 and 66,797 resident deaths reported producing mortality rates of 9.3 and 9.0 respectively. In 1975 there were 2.1 percent fewer deaths reported (65,422) than in 1974 resulting in the lowest mortality rate ever recorded in New Jersey (8.8).

The mortality rates remained higher among males than females, and among the white population as compared to the nonwhite population. There were 35,104 male deaths in 1975 compared to 36,013 in 1974, a decrease of 2.5 percent. A total of 30,318 female deaths were reported in 1975 compared with 30,784 in 1974, a decrease of 1.5 percent. The white male mortality rate

was 10.0 in 1975 based on 31,340 deaths, while in 1974, 32,149 deaths among white males produced a rate of 10.1. Among the white female population there were 27,435 deaths in 1975 (8.1 per 1,000) compared with 27,844 white female deaths in 1974 (8.2 per 1,000). Among the nonwhite population the percentage decreases in deaths among males (2.6) and females (1.9) were similar to those recorded among white males and females. The result was a more dramatic decrease in mortality rates. In 1975 there were 3,764 nonwhite male deaths while in 1974 there were 3,864 nonwhite male deaths. The mortality rate decreased from 9.7 per 1,000 in 1974 to 8.9 per 1,000 in 1975. Among nonwhite females there were 2,883 deaths in 1975 producing a rate of 6.1. In 1974 the nonwhite female mortality rate was 6.6 based on 2,940 deaths.

The decrease in the number of deaths and the overall mortality rate in New Jersey can be attributed to decreases in four of the five leading causes of death. In 1975 there were 27,378 deaths attributed to diseases of the heart compared with 28,160 in 1974, a decrease of 2.8 percent, producing rates of 368.3 and 380.1 per 100,000 in the two years, respectively. There were 8.2 percent fewer deaths due to cerebrovascular disease in 1975 (5,831 compared with 6,351 in 1974), resulting in a reduction in the mortality rate from 85.7 in 1974 to 78.4 per 100,000 in 1975. There were 4.6 fewer accidental deaths in 1975 (2,602) compared with 1974 (2,728). Finally, there were 7.4 percent fewer deaths as a result of influenza and pneumonia (1,616 in 1975 compared to 1,745 in 1974). The number of deaths due to malignant neoplasms continued to increase, however. In 1974 there were 13,999 deaths due to this disease producing a rate of 188.9 per 100,000. In 1975 there were 14,377, an increase of 2.7 percent resulting in a mortality rate of 193.4 per 100,000.

The estimated mortality rate in the United States dropped from 9.2 per 1,000 in 1974 to 9.0 per 1,000 in 1975 with a decrease in the number of deaths of approximately 1.3 percent based on provisional estimates of deaths for 1975. The number of deaths throughout the United States attributed to diseases of the heart decreased 2.1 percent with the mortality rate dropping from 349.2 per 100,000 in 1974 to 339.0 per 100,000 in 1975, considerably lower than rates reported for New Jersey. Cerebrovascular deaths throughout the United States decreased 5.7 percent, with the mortality rate dropping from 98.1 in 1974 to 91.8 per 100,000 in 1975. These rates were higher than those recorded in New Jersey. The United States accidental death rate dropped from 49.5 to 47.6 per 100,000 in 1975, as 3.1 percent fewer deaths were reported. The number of reported deaths and the mortality rates for the two remaining leading causes of death increased from 1974 to 1975. Deaths attributed to malignant neoplasms increased 3.1 percent with a 1975 provisional mortality rate of 174.4 reported. This rate was the highest ever recorded for the United States. New Jersey's crude rate still remains considerably higher, however. Five percent more deaths were attributed to "Influenza and pneumonia", with the major increase occurring in influenza deaths due to the early 1975 outbreak. There were 4,780 influenza deaths in 1975 compared with 2,201 in 1974. The number of pneumonia deaths remained virtually unchanged (52,740 in 1975 compared with 52,576 in 1974).

RESIDENT INFANT AND FETAL DEATHS: An infant death is defined as the death of a baby under one year of age, no matter how short a period of time the baby breathed or shown other evidence of life. A fetal death is defined as a death prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy. Another term for fetal death is stillbirth. Fetal deaths brought about through use of some artificial mechanism are known as induced abortions, while natural fetal deaths are termed spontaneous abortions. In New Jersey, only fetal deaths occurring during or after completion of twenty or more weeks gestation are required, by law, to be reported to the state registrar, via the fetal death certificate. Fetal death statistics presented in this report are based on tabulations of these certificates and hence do not include induced abortions.

The infant mortality rate in New Jersey has continued to decrease since 1960 when 3,248 infant deaths (24.5 per 1,000 live births) were reported. Since 1970 the decrease in the number of infant deaths and the infant mortality rate itself has been most dramatic. In 1970 there were 2,406 infant deaths producing a rate of 20.0 per 1,000 live births. The infant mortality rates for 1971, 1972 and 1973 were 18.8, 18.3 and 17.5 respectively. In 1974 1,582 infant deaths produced a rate of 16.8. In 1975 9.4 percent fewer infant deaths (1,434) resulted in a mortality rate of 15.7.

Data for 1973, 1974 and 1975 were revised in September 1976 to reflect the receipt of additional information on a number of infant and fetal deaths occurring in Newark which were previously unreported. Among the more populated municipalities in New Jersey, the highest infant mortality rates were reported for Camden City (37.6) and Trenton (31.7). In fact, for both these municipalities the infant mortality rates were higher in 1975 than in 1974. By contrast, Newark reported 42.9 percent fewer infant deaths in 1975 than in 1974, after correction for the late reports were received. It is possible, and almost probable that additional infant deaths occurring in Newark during 1975 remain unreported, so that the apparent dramatic decrease in infant mortality in Newark (30.1 per 1,000 live births in 1974, 18.4 per 1,000 live births in 1975) is somewhat suspect. In Jersey City the infant death rate dropped from 28.9 to 21.5 per 1,000 live births, based on a reported 30.3 percent fewer infant deaths.

Neonatal deaths include all infant deaths occurring during the first twenty-eight days of life. There were 13.1 percent fewer neonatal deaths in 1975 than in 1974 resulting in a neonatal mortality rate of 11.4, the lowest ever recorded in New Jersey. As was the case with infant mortality, the neonatal mortality rate has also declined dramatically since 1970 when 1,915 neonatal deaths produced a rate of 15.9 deaths per 1,000 live births.

In 1970 there were 1,698 fetal deaths producing a rate of 14.1 per 1,000 live births. By 1975 there were 44.6 percent fewer fetal deaths (941) producing a rate of 10.3 per 1,000 live births. As was the case for neonatal and infant mortality, the fetal death rate was the lowest ever recorded in New Jersey. The highest fetal death rate among larger municipalities in New Jersey occurred in Middletown Township where a reported 16 fetal deaths produced a rate of 25.4. By contrast, in 1974 there were only

six fetal deaths reported in Middletown. In Jersey City there were 79 fetal deaths in 1974 (19.1 per 1,000) and only 52 in 1975 (13.5 per 1,000). These figures are consistent with the decrease in infant mortality in that city. In Parsippany-Troy Hills there was one fetal death reported in 1975.

Some question has arisen concerning the definition of perinatal mortality. Perinatal mortality is an artificial mechanism used to measure mortality occurring in the later stages of pregnancy or the early stages of life. The World Health Organization has offered two alternative methods of calculating perinatal mortality, both of which differ from that previous used by the Public Health Statistics Program and some other states. The first definition defines perinatal mortality to include fetal deaths of twenty-eight or more weeks of gestation plus infant deaths occurring in the first week of life. Data is not available to make this calculation possible. The second definition defines perinatal mortality to include fetal deaths of twenty or more weeks gestation plus neonatal deaths. This definition is the one used in this report. Perinatal mortality rates for prior years have been recalculated to reflect this definition.

As would be expected, the perinatal mortality rate reflects both infant and fetal mortality, as it too has gradually decreased each year. In 1951 there were 3,910 perinatal deaths producing a rate of 36.5 deaths per 1,000 live births plus fetal deaths. By 1967 the number of perinatal deaths had dropped to 3,883 resulting in a rate of 32.9. Since 1967 the perinatal mortality rate has dropped dramatically. In 1975 there were only 1,983 perinatal deaths, a decrease of 48.9 percent, producing a rate of 21.5.

In 1974 there were 1,052 white infant deaths and 530 nonwhite infant deaths. In 1975 there were 984 white infant deaths and 450 nonwhite deaths, representing decreases of 6.5 and 15.1 percent respectively. Infant and fetal death rates by race have not been included in any tables in this report due to the great number of births for which race was not given. There were 772 white and 298 nonwhite fetal deaths in 1974, compared with 663 white and 277 nonwhite fetal deaths in 1975, representing decreases of 14.1 and 7.0 percent respectively. There were 818 white and 381 nonwhite neonatal deaths in 1974 compared with 729 white and 313 nonwhite neonatal deaths in 1975. The decrease in white neonatal deaths was 10.9 percent while the number of nonwhite deaths decreased 17.8 percent. For the purposes of providing some method of comparing infant, fetal and neonatal mortality by race, births by race, used as the denominator in calculating rates, have been estimated. The assumption made was that the racial distribution of these births for which race was not given was the same as the distribution of births for which race was stated. The table below represents the computation of infant, fetal, and neonatal mortality rates using these artificial denominators.

As can be seen from these estimates the infant, neonatal and fetal death rates appear to have decreased for both the white and nonwhite populations, although rates among the nonwhite population remain substantially higher.

While the number of fetal deaths has declined overall, the number of fetal deaths among teenage mothers remained almost constant. In 1975 there were 146 fetal deaths among teenagers producing a fetal death rate of 11.6. In 1974 there were 148 fetal deaths or 11.3 per 1,000 live births to teenage mothers. Among women 40 and older the fetal death rate was highest. In 1975 there were 33.7 deaths per 1,000 live births based on 33 fetal deaths. In 1974 there were 39.1 fetal deaths per 1,000 live births. The percentage of mature fetal deaths (fetal deaths of 2,501 grams or more) decreased only slightly (27.7 percent in 1974, 27.4 percent in 1975). In 1974 20.9 percent of fetal deaths were illegitimate. In 1975 25.3 percent were illegitimate.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF INFANT MORTALITY: The ten leading causes of infant death are listed in the table below. Congenital anomalies remain the leading cause of death. Included in this broad categories were deaths attributed to congenital anomalies of the heart (102) respiratory system (15), digestive system (14), musculoskeletal system (21), and congenital syndromes affecting multiple systems (35). Also included are deaths attributed to anencephalus (24). A complete breakdown is shown in Table 13.

The ten leading causes of death account for 82.1 percent of infant deaths and 86.0 percent of neonatal deaths. Of these only two showed increases over the number reported in 1974. There were 12.2 percent more deaths attributed to symptoms and ill-defined conditions than reported in 1974 (131), and 12.8 percent more deaths attributed to birth injury without mention of cause. By contrast the 134 deaths attributed to immaturity represented a 16.3 percent decrease from the reported 160 deaths in 1974, and the 128 respiratory distress syndrome deaths represented a 23.8 decrease from the number (168) reported in 1974.

MATERNAL MORTALITY: There were only 14 maternal deaths reported in New Jersey in 1975 producing a maternal mortality rate of 1.5 deaths per 10,000 live births. This rate is less than one-fourth the rate recorded in 1951 (6.6) when 69 resident maternal deaths were reported. Provisional U. S. figures indicate a mortality rate of 1.1 per 10,000 live births.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF RESIDENT DEATH: The 13 leading causes of resident death account for nearly 90 percent of all resident deaths in New Jersey. The following table gives a summary of the mortality rates for these 13 causes by race and sex. The rankings for each cause group represent the composite ranking for all races, both sexes.

Mortality rates for each of the 13 causes shown can be seen to vary appreciably by race and by sex. The rank order also changes by race and sex. A more complete discussion of race and sex specific mortality rates shown in the above table will be included in proceeding sections of this report when each cause group is examined separately. Table 16 of this report gives a more complete breakdown of the number of deaths occurring in each race-sex group by age.

Table 17 provides a breakdown of the principal causes of resident death by age.

There were 241 deaths in the age group 1-4 compared with 291 in 1974, a decrease of 17.2 percent. The age-specific mortality rate dropped from 59.3 to 57.5 deaths per 100,000 children in this age group. There were 94 accidental deaths in 1975 compared to 107 in 1974, producing rates of 22.4 and

21.8 respectively. The number of deaths attributed to congenital anomalies dropped from 44 to 37, while influenza and pneumonia deaths dropped from 26 to 14. There were only 11 deaths resulting from malignant neoplasms in 1975 compared with 23 in 1974. Of serious concern is the rise in the number of 1-4 year olds dying as the result of homicide. There were five such cases in 1974 compared with 14 reported in 1975, a three-fold increase.

The mortality rate for 5-14 year olds increased slightly as 381 deaths were reported in 1975 compared to 376 in 1974. Nearly 48 percent of deaths in this age group resulted from accidents, with the accidental death rate increasing from 11.7 to 13.9 deaths per 100,000 in 1975. Malignant neoplasms remained the second leading cause of death in this age group with the mortality rate not changing appreciably over the previous year.

Although there were more reported deaths in the age group 15-24 for 1975 as compared to 1974, the mortality rate decreased. In 1975 there were 1,256 deaths producing an age-specific rate of 93.9 per 100,000, while in 1974 a reported 1,239 deaths resulted in a rate of 106.8. The mortality rates for each of the leading causes of death in this age group decreased with one exception. There were 112 suicides in 1975 compared with 86 in 1974, an increase of 30.2 percent, producing a mortality rate of 8.4 per 100,000 in 1975 compared to 7.4 per 100,000 in 1974.

There were 4.0 percent fewer deaths among people aged 25-44 in 1975, producing a mortality rate of 176.8 per 100,000, compared to a rate of 183.2 per 100,000 in 1974. The mortality rate for malignant neoplasms, the principal cause of death increased slightly from 35.0 deaths per 100,000 in 1974 to 36.5 deaths per 100,000 in 1975. The mortality rates for diseases of the heart, accidents, cirrhosis of the liver, and homicide, the second, third, fourth, and fifth leading causes decreased slightly. Again of striking concern is the increase in suicides, the sixth leading cause. There were 199 suicides of persons aged 15-44 in 1975 compared to 175 in 1974, resulting in mortality rates of 11.1 and 9.7 per 100,000 respectively.

There were 3.2 percent fewer deaths among persons aged 45-64 in 1975 with a reduction in the mortality rate from 1009.0 to 947.8 per 100,000. The mortality rates for each of the principal causes of death were lower in 1975, with the most marked reduction occurring in the number of reported deaths due to diseases of the heart. There were 6,154 such deaths in 1975 compared to 6,606 in 1974. The 6.8 percent decrease produced a 1975 rate of 358.1 per 100,000 compared to a 1974 rate of 396.2 per 100,000.

Among persons 65 and older 42,646 deaths were reported in 1974 compared to 43,176 in 1975 producing a lower mortality rate (5604.4 per 100,000 in 1975 compared to 5993.7 per 100,000 in 1974). A reduction in the mortality rates for each principal cause of death was seen. The five leading causes of death in this age group were diseases of the heart, malignant neoplasms, cerebrovascular disease, influenza and pneumonia, and diabetes mellitus.

In summary, the mortality rate for diseases of the heart decreased for persons aged 25 and older. The mortality rate for malignant neoplasms decreased for persons 45 and older, persons under five, and persons aged 15-24, while increasing for all other age groups. The accidental death rate increased among younger people, and decreased among older people, and finally the number of suicides among the young have increased substantially.

MAJOR CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES: Major cardiovascular diseases include 1) diseases of the heart, 2) hypertension, 3) cerebrovascular disease, 4) arteriosclerosis and 5) other diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries. In 1974 there were 36,332 deaths attributed to major cardiovascular diseases while in 1975 34,978 such deaths occurred. The mortality rate dropped from 490.4 to 470.5 per 100,000 population. The rate for New Jersey residents still remained somewhat higher than the provisional rate of 459.4 reported for the United States.

Diseases of the heart continued to be the number one cause of death among New Jersey residents irrespective of race or sex, although race and sex specific mortality rates differ dramatically. There were 13,743 deaths among the white male population in 1975 producing a rate of 436.6 per 100,000. Among the nonwhite male population the mortality rate was 256.6 per 100,000 based on 1,080 deaths. Among white females there were 11,620 deaths (342.4 per 100,000) and among nonwhite females 935 deaths (198.4 per 100,000) occurred. Diseases of the heart were the principal cause of death among white males and nonwhite males 25 years of age and older, among white females 65 and older, and among nonwhite females 45 and older. Diseases of the heart could be subclassified into three groupings 1) acute myocardial infarction 2) chronic ischemic heart diseases and 3) all other diseases of the heart. In 1975 there were 12,069 deaths resulting from acute myocardial infarction (162.4 per 100,000 population) and 13,328 deaths resulting from ischemic heart disease (179.3 per 100,000). In 1974 the mortality rates for acute myocardial infarction, and ischemic heart disease were 172.0 and 182.6 per 100,000 based on 12,744 and 13,526 deaths, respectively.

Although cerebrovascular disease remained the third leading cause of death in New Jersey there were 8.2 percent fewer deaths caused by this disease in 1975 compared with the prior year. The mortality rate has steadily decreased since 1952 where there were 99.9 deaths per 100,000 population. In 1974, 6,351 persons died of cerebrovascular (85.7 per 100,000) while in 1975, 5,831 such deaths (78.4 per 100,000) population were reported. Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death among white males (69.0 per 100,000), white females (91.7 per 100,000) and nonwhite females (63.2 per 100,000). The mortality rate for nonwhite males was lower than that reported for others (59.2 per 100,000), making this disease the fourth leading cause of death. Nationwide the cerebrovascular disease mortality rates for 1974 and 1975 were 98.1 and 91.8 respectively. Included in the classification for cerebrovascular disease are deaths attributed to cerebral thrombosis (1,796), acute but ill-defined cerebrovascular disease (1,532), generalized ischemic cerebrovascular disease (1,046, cerebral hemorrhage (957), and subarachnoid hemorrhage (324).

Arteriosclerosis was the tenth leading cause of death among New Jersey residents in 1975. Most deaths due to this disease occur in the elderly. Of the total of 758 (10.2 per 100,000), 721 involved persons aged 65 and older. Mortality rates are higher in the female population, and among the white population compared with the nonwhite population. The mortality rate for white males was 7.8 per 100,000, and for white females, 13.8 per 100,000. Among nonwhite males there were 4.5 deaths per 100,000, while for nonwhite females there were 4.7 deaths per 100,000. Nationwide the mortality rate was higher with 13.7 deaths per 100,000 population reported, representing a decrease from the 1974 reported rate of 15.3 per 100,000. The mortality rate for New Jersey residents in 1974 was 10.1 per 100,000.

Other diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries include aortic aneurysm (nonsyphilitic) (472 deaths in 1975), arterial embolism and thrombosis (156 deaths), and gangrene (100), plus some additional classifications. There were 810 total deaths (10.9 per 100,000) attributed to this, the eighth leading cause of death in New Jersey. A total of 871 deaths were reported in 1974 (11.8 per 100,000).

Hypertension caused the deaths of 201 New Jersey residents in 1974 and again in 1975, with the mortality rate also remaining unchanged (2.7). The United States mortality rate was estimated at 3.0 based on a provisional figure of 6,370 deaths.

CANCER: Deaths attributable to cancer continue to increase in New Jersey as well as throughout the United States. In New Jersey in 1975, there were 193.4 deaths per 100,000 people resulting from malignant neoplasms based on a reported 14,377 deaths. The mortality rate for the entire United States was 174.4, the highest ever recorded. Mortality rates differed markedly by race and sex. The mortality rate for white males was 219.7 (based on 6,915 deaths), while for nonwhite males 715 deaths produced a rate of 169.9. There were 6,210 white female deaths and 537 nonwhite female deaths, providing rates of 183.0 and 114.0 respectively. Malignant neoplasms were the second leading cause of death for New Jersey residents irrespective of race and sex.

Cancer of the buccal cavity and pharynx resulted in 258 deaths among men (7.2 per 100,000) and 96 deaths among females (2.5 per 100,000). Cancer of the digestive organs and peritoneum had the highest site specific mortality rate (58.3), with a slight difference in the male and female mortality rates observed. There were 2,255 male deaths (63.2 per 100,000), and 2,081 female deaths (53.8 per 100,000) reported. Of the 4,336 deaths attributed to cancer of the digestive organs and peritoneum there were 1,819 malignant neoplasms of the large intestine, 735 deaths due to cancer of the pancreas, 692 attributed to cancer of the stomach, 477 attributed to cancer of the rectum, 274 due to cancer of the esophagus, and 339 deaths due to other neoplasms of the digestive organs and peritoneum. There were 2,528 male deaths and 803 female deaths due to cancer of the respiratory system producing mortality rates of 70.8 and 20.8 per 100,000 respectively. Cancer of the trachea, bronchus and lung, a subclassification of the respiratory system was responsible for 2,377 male and 773 female deaths. Cancer of the breast was the highest single cause of cancer mortality among women with 35.0 deaths per 100,000 women reported in 1975 based on 1,353 deaths. There were 1,179

male and 1,134 female deaths due to malignant neoplasms of the genitourinary organs (33.0 and 29.3 deaths per 100,000) respectively. This category included 676 deaths due to cancer of the prostate among men. Female deaths in this category included 440 deaths due to cancer of the ovaries, fallopian tube and broad ligament, 252 deaths attributed to cancer of the uterus, and 185 deaths resulting from cancer of the cervix uteri. Also included in this broad category of cancers of the genitourinary organs were malignant neoplasms of the bladder (294 male deaths, 113 female deaths), and malignant neoplasms of other and unspecified urinary organs (184 male deaths, 105 female deaths).

ACCIDENTS: There were 2,602 resident deaths in 1975 as the result of accidents compared with 2,728 in 1974, a decrease of 4.6 percent. This produced a slight decrease in the mortality rate with 36.8 deaths per 100,000 reported in 1974 and 35.0 deaths per 100,000 reported in 1975. Among the white male population accidents remained the fourth leading cause of death with 46.1 deaths per 100,000 reported based on 1,452 deaths. Among nonwhite males there were 327 deaths or 77.7 deaths per 100,000 population. The accident mortality rate was considerably lower in the female population. There were 698 white female and 125 nonwhite female deaths in 1975, with mortality rates of 20.6 and 26.5 respectively. The accident mortality rate in the United States decreased slightly but remained higher than the rate in New Jersey as 47.6 deaths per 100,000 were reported based on an estimated 101,400 deaths. There were 1,111 motor vehicle resident deaths in New Jersey in 1975 compared with 1,120 in 1974 with the mortality rate decreasing from 15.1 to 14.9. There were 19.7 percent fewer accidental poisonings with the mortality rate dropping from 4.0 to 3.2 per 100,000 population. There were 572 deaths due to falls in 1974, and 554 such deaths in 1975, with a 1975 mortality rate of 7.5. There were 10.3 percent more deaths resulting from fires (185 in 1974, 204 in 1975).

Accidents were the principal cause of death of persons under 25 years of age, although accidental mortality rates were highest in those aged 65 and older. There were 119 deaths of children under 5 years of age and 182 deaths

of children 5-14 years of age producing age-specific rates of 23.3 and 13.9 respectively. Among persons under 65 years of age the highest accident rates occurred among those 15-24 years of age as 630 deaths resulted in a mortality rate of 47.1. There were 513 deaths of persons aged 25-44 and 478 deaths of persons aged 45-64 with mortality rates of 28.6 and 27.8 respectively. Among the elderly, there were 680 deaths producing a rate of 89.4 deaths per 100,000 persons aged 65 and older. Most motor vehicle fatalities involved teenagers and young adults with 388 deaths occurring in the age group 15-24 producing a rate of 29.0 per 100,000. The motor vehicle fatality rate was also high in those 65 and older with 22.1 deaths per 100,000 reported based on 168 deaths. Of the 236 accidental deaths due to poisonings there were 94 deaths among those aged 15-24 (7.0 per 100,000), and 88 deaths among those 25-44 (4.9 per 100,000). Sixty-six percent of all deaths due to falls were of persons aged 65 and older. The mortality rate of 48.4 per 100,000 senior citizens was based on a reported 368 accidental deaths resulting from falls. Mortality due to fires was greatest among the very young (under 5), and the elderly, with 7.4 deaths per 100,000 children under 5, and 4.3 deaths per 100,000 adults aged 65 and older.

INFLUENZA AND PNEUMONIA: The fifth leading cause of death resulted in the deaths of 1,616 residents in 1975 compared to 1,745 in 1974 with a resulting mortality rate of 21.7 per 100,000 estimated population. The mortality rate for the white population was slightly higher than that for the non-white population, as 1,433 white deaths were reported (21.9 per 100,000) compared to 183 nonwhite deaths (20.5 per 100,000). There were 1,153 deaths among those 65+ (151.5 per 100,000), making this the fourth leading cause of death in that age group, 282 deaths among those 45-64 years of age (16.4 per 100,000), and 181 deaths among those under 45 years of age (5.4 per 100,000). The mortality rate for the United States was slightly higher as 27.0 deaths per 100,000 population were reported in 1975.

DIABETES MELLITUS: Diabetes, the sixth leading cause of New Jersey resident deaths claimed the lives of 1,416 persons in 1975 and 1,449 lives in 1974. The mortality rate declined from 19.6 to 19.0. Rates for the female population remained higher than those for the male population with no apparent differences seen with respect to race. There were 15.4 male deaths per 100,000 men in the population and 22.4 female deaths per 100,000 women in the population. There were 160 deaths in the male population 45-64 (19.7 per 100,000), and 163 deaths in the female population 45-64 (18.0 per 100,000). Among the elderly, there were 353 male deaths (117.3 per 100,000) and 672 female deaths (146.1 per 100,000). The United States mortality rates in 1974 and 1975 were 17.7 and 16.8 respectively, based on 37,329 deaths in 1974, and a provisional estimate of 35,890 deaths in 1975.

HOMICIDE: The number of New Jersey residents dying each year as the result of homicide has remained relatively constant since 1972 when 499 deaths were reported. In subsequent years, 1973, 1974 and 1975 a total of 523, 513, and 520 deaths were reported. The 1975 figure constitutes a rate of 7.0 per 100,000 population. Since 1951 the number of homicide deaths in New Jersey has increased more than four-fold, and the mortality rate has more than tripled. The homicide mortality rates differ markedly by race and sex. Among

the nonwhite male population there were 206 homicide deaths in 1975 producing a mortality rate of 49.0 per 100,000, and making homicide the fifth leading cause of nonwhite male deaths. Better than one in 20 nonwhite male deaths were the result of homicide. By contrast there were 169 white male deaths resulting from homicide (5.4 per 100,000), 72 white female deaths (2.1 per 100,000), and 73 nonwhite female deaths (15.5 per 100,000). There were 139 homicide deaths involving young people aged 15-24 (10.4 per 100,000), making homicide the second leading cause of death in this age group. The highest age-specific mortality rate occurred in the age group 25-44, with 205 deaths producing a rate of 11.4. The mortality rate among nonwhite males aged 15-24 was 66.6 per 100,000 based on 57 deaths. For those aged 25-44 the rate soared to 94.4 based on 96 deaths. The mortality rate due to homicide nationwide remained higher as an estimated 21,730 deaths produced a rate of 10.2 in 1975, the same as recorded for 1974.

SUICIDE: The suicide mortality rate has fluctuated over the past 25 years with the 1975 rate of 8.2 (based on 612 deaths) exceeding the 1974 rate of 7.7 (based on 572 deaths). The suicide rate was higher among men than women, and among the white population as compared to the nonwhite. There were 405 white male deaths in 1975 producing a mortality rate of 12.9 per 100,000. Thirty-nine nonwhite male deaths resulted in a rate of 9.3. Among the female population there were 156 white female deaths and 12 nonwhite female deaths producing rates of 4.6 and 2.5 respectively. The suicide rate was highest among those aged 65+ (12.5) with 95 deaths reported. There were 112 suicide victims aged 15-24 and 199 aged 25-44, with age-specific rates of 8.4 and 11.1 per 100,000 respectively. Among those 45-64 there were 205 deaths with a mortality rate of 11.9. The higher overall suicide rate can be attributed to the 30.2 percent increase in the number of suicides among young people aged 15-24, and the 13.7 percent increase in the number of suicides among persons aged 25-44. The national suicide mortality rate was considerably higher than New Jersey's rate with an estimated 26,960 deaths in 1975 producing a mortality rate of 12.6.

OTHER SELECTED CAUSES OF DEATH: Cirrhosis of the liver claimed the lives of 1,235 New Jersey residents in 1975, a decrease of 8.2 percent from the reported 1,346 deaths in 1974, producing an overall mortality rate of 16.6 per 100,000. The national figures in 1974 and 1975 were 15.8 and 15.1 respectively. Rates were twice as high among men, and slightly higher in the white population. There were 680 white male deaths and 365 white female deaths resulting in mortality rates of 21.6 and 10.8 respectively. Among nonwhite males 121 deaths were recorded, while 69 nonwhite female deaths occurred, producing rates of 28.8 and 14.6 respectively.

Bronchitis, emphysema and asthma resulted in the death of 664 New Jersey residents in 1975, 9.7 percent fewer than the reported 735 deaths in 1974. The mortality rate for 1975 was 8.9 per 100,000 compared with a rate of 9.9 for 1974. There were 322 deaths attributed to peptic ulcers in 1975, and 279 such deaths in 1974. A total of 296 deaths were due to nephritis and nephrosis in 1975 compared with 277 in 1974. The number of deaths resulting from hernia and intestinal obstruction dropped from 200 in 1974 to 174 in 1975.

NOTIFIABLE DISEASE MORBIDITY: The number of reported cases of syphilis decreased for the second consecutive year while the number of reported cases of gonorrhea increased sharply. In 1972 there were 2,636 new cases of syphilis reported in New Jersey, considerably less than that reported in 1971. The apparent dramatic decrease was largely the result of improvements made in the tabulation of data which effectively eliminated duplicate counts of cases which had previously been reported. In 1973, and 1974 there were 2,895, and 2,634 cases of syphilis reported, providing incidence rates of 39.3 and 35.6 cases (civilian only) per 100,000 estimated population. In 1975, 2,410 cases were reported with an incidence rate of 32.4. An additional 21 cases were reported by the military. Of the total of 2,431 cases reported, there were 771 cases of primary and secondary syphilis cases, 666 cases of early latent syphilis, 966 cases of late and late latent syphilis and 28 cases of congenital syphilis. The morbidity rate for primary and secondary syphilis was 10.4 compared with a rate of 11.5 reported in 1974. The early latent incidence rate increased from 8.5 in 1974 to 9.0 in 1975. The number of cases of late and late latent syphilis decreased 15.9 percent and reduced the incidence rate from 15.5 to 13.0. The gonorrhea incidence rate decreased in 1973 and 1974, but increased dramatically in 1975, when 17,261 reported cases produced an incidence rate of 232.2 per 100,000 population (excluding military). An additional 597 military cases produced an overall rate of 240.2. This dramatic increase in reported cases of gonorrhea might be indicative of an ever-growing problem, and is most probably indicative of improved surveillance resulting in fewer cases going undetected. The sharpest rise in reported cases of gonorrhea occurred in the age group 25-44 where 21.6 percent more cases were reported in 1975. The result was an increase in the age-specific rate from 238.9 to 292.2 cases per 100,000 population. The highest incidence rates however are still in the age groups 15-19 (680.7) and 20-24 (1,041.1). The highest age-specific incidence rates for syphilis also are seen in these age groups. The gonorrhea incidence rate for men in 1975 (326.8) was twice as great as that for women (160.3). Similarly, incidence of syphilis was higher among men (40.4) than among women (25.6). As might be expected, there is a large difference in the incidence rates for primary and secondary syphilis between men and women, while the incidence rates at later stages differ to a much smaller degree, due to the fact that syphilis in the male population is easier to detect at an early stage, while such detection among women is not as common.

The number of newly reported cases of tuberculosis has gradually decreased over the last twenty years. In 1955 there were 3,665 cases reported with a morbidity rate of 66.9 per 100,000 population. In 1975 there were 1,362 cases reported with an incidence rate of 18.3. Of this total there were 1,271 clinically active cases reported. No comparative figure for 1974 is available as the definitions in Diagnostic Standards of Tuberculosis and other Mycobacterial Diseases were changed in 1974 and became effective in 1975. Clinically active cases are now defined as cases with a culture positive for M.tG or those on two or more anti-tuberculosis drugs. The count includes those who were on no drugs or one drug prior to 1975, and whose drug regimen was increased to two or more anti-tuberculosis drugs in 1975.

The incidence of serum hepatitis increased in 1975 from that reported in 1974. The number of serum hepatitis cases increased 46.0 percent with 1,235 cases reported in 1975 compared with 846 in 1974. The incidence rate rose from 11.4 to 16.6 per 100,000 population. Infectious hepatitis incidence rose 3.3 percent as 952 cases in 1975 produced a rate of 12.8. In 1974 there were 922 cases with a rate of 12.4 per 100,000. There were 375 cases of hepatitis (unspecified) in 1975 compared with 299 cases in 1974 an increase of 25.4 percent. Incidence rates were highest in the age group 20-24, the same being true in 1974. There were 312 serum hepatitis cases, 235 infectious hepatitis cases and 107 cases of hepatitis (unspecified), producing an overall incidence of 106.7 cases per 100,000 persons aged 20-24. Incidence was higher among men than women with 1,503 cases of hepatitis reported among men (42.1 per 100,000), and 1,059 cases reported in the female population (27.4 per 100,000).

In 1974 there were 5,693 cases of measles (rubeola) reported. In 1975 there were only 477 such cases. There were 465 cases of mumps in 1975 compared with 784 cases in 1974. In 1974 there were 454 cases of shigellosis (bacillary dysentery) and only 255 cases in 1975. A total of 55 meningococcal infections and 94 cases of amebiasis were reported in 1974 compared with 24 cases of meningococcal infections and 81 cases of amebiasis in 1975. On the negative side, there were 151 cases of aseptic meningitis in 1974 and 345 cases in 1975. The number of reported cases of rubella (German measles) doubled with 465 cases in 1974 compared with 1,021 in 1975. There were 47 cases of trichinosis in 1975, and only 17 in 1974.

APPENDIX A

Glossary of Terms

AGE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of persons of a given age group per 100,000 estimated persons in that age group usually expressed as an annual rate.

CAUSE GROUP - a summary of deaths resulting from, or cases of, related diseases as defined by the International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States, published by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; usually specified by a series of 3-digit codes i.e. 140-209 - malignant neoplasms.

CAUSE-3 DIGIT - the cause of death or morbidity as defined by a 3-digit code in the International List. Disease conditions are also further classified and so specified, by the addition of a decimal point and a fourth digit. For example, the three digit code "140" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lip, and the four digit code "140.1" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lower lip.

ESTIMATED POPULATION - the estimated number of persons in a given group based on the latest census data and adjusted for annual births, annual deaths and net migration.

FETAL DEATH - a death prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy also known as a stillbirth. The death of an infant that has breathed or shown other evidence of life, no matter for how short a period, should be reported as a live birth and an infant death.

FETAL DEATH RATES - the number of fetal deaths occurring in the twentieth week of gestation or later (required by law to be registered as fetal deaths) per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

FERTILITY RATE - the number of live births to women aged 15-44 per 1,000 women in this age group, usually expressed as an annual rate.

ILLEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to an unwed mother, or to a mother whose husband did not father the infant.

ILLEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to an unwed mother, or a mother whose husband did not father the fetus.

INFANT DEATH - the death of a baby under one year of age, no matter how short a period a time the baby breathed or shown other evidence of life.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE - the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

INTERNATIONAL LIST - a listing of disease classifications known as the "International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States" published by the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, used in the statistical coding and tabulation of specific disease morbidity and mortality.

LEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to a married woman whose husband fathered the infant.

LEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to a married woman whose husband fathered the fetus.

MATERNAL DEATH - a death of a woman occurring during the period of pregnancy or following delivery of the infant and related to the pregnancy or delivery of the infant.

MATERNAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

MORBIDITY - the relative incidence (number of cases) of disease, usually used with respect to specific disease conditions i.e. tuberculosis morbidity refers to the number of cases of tuberculosis.

MORTALITY - the number of deaths.

NEONATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the newborn and especially the human infant during the first month of life.

NEONATAL MORTALITY RATE - as used in this text, the number of deaths of infants under 28 days of age per 1,000 live births, per year.

NET MIGRATION - the difference in population resulting from persons attaining residency status, and persons dropping residency status, often referred to as in-migration and out-migration, respectively.

PERINATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the fetus and the newborn, especially the human infant during the first month of life.

PERINATAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of infants less than 28 days of age, and registered fetal deaths per 1,000 live births plus registered fetal deaths.

RACE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths in a given ethnic group per 100,000 estimated population in that ethnic group.

SELECTED PLACES - as used in this report, cities, townships and municipalities with a population of 45,000 or more as of the 1970 census.

SEX-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of males/females per 100,000 estimated males/females in the population.
