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INTRODUCTION

On July 1, 1977 the Public Health Statistics Program was administratively reassigned to the Division of Health Planning and Resources Development as part of the newly created Health Data Research and Analysis Services Unit. This report, published for the fifteenth consecutive year, provides detailed and summary information on births, marriages, deaths, disease morbidity and population for the calendar year 1976, and represents Volume I of a planned series of annual publications covering all areas of health data need.

The data included in this report were compiled from information included on birth, marriage, death, and fetal death certificates filed with the state registrar prior to May 1, 1977. Natality, Marriage, Mortality, and Morbidity rates for prior years were recomputed to reflect revisions in population estimates.

It should be noted that births, deaths, and fetal deaths are compiled for all residents of the state regardless of their place of occurrence. This overall compilation is made possible by a reciprocal arrangement among states, whereby copies of birth, death and fetal death certificates are routinely forwarded to the resident's home state. Copies of marriage certificates are not interchanged among states. Marriage rates are computed and shown in this report by place of occurrence.

The Office of Demographic and Economic Analysis, Department of Labor and Industry, provides population data. The population estimates published in December, 1976 by that office were used in preparing the rates appearing in this report.

The Tuberculosis Services Program, the Venereal Disease Program, the Hepatitis Surveillance Program and the Communicable Disease Control Program provided incidence data.

This report is subdivided into five sections with each section consisting of a brief narrative analysis followed by a series of tables. The first section entitled the "Overview", provides a brief summary of birth, marriage, death, fetal death, and population trends for New Jersey for the past twenty-five years. Subsequent sections on "Births", "Marriages", "Deaths", and "Morbidity", provide more detailed data on these subjects. Consideration is being given for a more extensive revision of the report for 1977. Some additional information not included in this report may be obtained from the Health Data Services Vital Statistics Section upon request.

The joint efforts of the personnel of the above mentioned programs and of the Vital Statistics Section of Health Data Services, Data Processing, and Graphic Arts Services, made this report possible.

OVERVIEW

POPULATION TRENDS

The provisional population estimate of New Jersey for July 1, 1976 was 7,431,750, an increase of two-tenths of one percent over the revised population figure of 7,414,700 for July 1, 1975. These estimates were published by the Office of Demographic and Economic Analysis in December, 1976.

There were 90,701 resident births and 65,796 resident deaths occurring between July 1, 1975 and June 30, 1976, resulting in a natural increase of 24,905. There were 7,855 more people leaving New Jersey than entering (net migration) resulting in an overall population increase of 17,050. This estimated net migration may be partly due to a high rate of unemployment that has prevailed over the last few years.

Population in the state of New Jersey has increased continuously since 1952. The rate of increase, however, has been declining, and has been nearly negligible in the 1970's. The estimated increase for the period 1970-1971 was one percent. In subsequent years the estimated increases were eight-tenths of one percent (1971-1972), six-tenths of one percent (1972-1973), four tenths of one-percent (1973-1974), and two-tenths of one percent over the last two years for which estimates were available.

There are an estimated 3,563,756 male (48.0%) and 3,867,994 female (52.0%) residents in New Jersey.

New Jersey has a land area of 7,521 square miles producing a population density of 988.1 persons per square mile. In 1970 New Jersey was the most densely populated state in the nation.

BIRTH TREND

Over the past twenty years the birth rate in New Jersey has decreased dramatically. In 1957 there were 129,257 resident births producing a birth rate of 22.6 per 1,000 persons in the population. In 1976 only 90,549 resident births were recorded resulting in a record low birth rate of 12.2 per 1,000 population. Since 1970 the number of births has decreased 24.6 percent, with the birth rate dropping from 16.7 to its present level. The fertility rate has likewise continued to decrease. In 1960 there were 106.1 resident births per 1,000 women aged 15-44. By 1970 the fertility rate had dropped to 81.2. In 1975 there were 91,101 births to women aged 15-44 with a fertility rate of 56.6 while in 1976 a total of 90,224 births produced a rate of 55.2. The fertility rate which has exhibited a dramatic decrease over the last twenty years appears to be leveling off. Since the large cohort of women born between 1957 and 1964 is beginning to reach childbearing age, the birth rate over the next several years is expected to gradually increase, but is not expected to reach pre-1964 levels due to the reduced fertility rate.

The dramatic decrease in the fertility rate since 1970 may reflect a propensity of more young marrieds toward having none, one, or perhaps no more than two children, which in turn is reflected in the greater knowledge and use of birth control methods, as well as the increase in abortions brought about by its legalization. The high cost of living, and in particular the high cost of education, as well as inflation may be cited as contributory factors.

MARRIAGE TRENDS

There were 3.2 percent fewer marriages performed in New Jersey in 1976 than were reported in 1975 (51,291 and 53,008 marriages respectively). This resulted in a rate of 6.9 marriages occurring in New Jersey per 1,000 population. The marriage rate in New Jersey appears to be cyclical in nature, with no apparent basis for such cycles evident. Between 1952 and 1958 the marriage rate dropped from 8.0 to 6.6 per 1,000. For the next five years the rate fluctuated between 6.6 and 6.5. Between 1963 and 1973 the marriage rate gradually increased to 8.1 per 1,000. Since 1973 the cycle has again reversed producing a declining rate. The number of marriages reported in 1976 were the lowest reported since 1967.

MORTALITY TRENDS

The number of resident deaths in New Jersey is a complete compilation of residents' mortalities, and includes resident deaths occurring out-of-state. This complete report is made possible by a reciprocal agreement between states calling for the interchange of copies of birth, death, and fetal death certificates (to be used for statistical purposes only).

During 1976 there were 65,276 resident deaths reported producing a rate of 8.8 per 1,000 estimated population, the same as that reported for 1975. The mortality rate has gradually declined over the past twenty-five years. In 1952, 51,430 deaths produced a mortality rate of 10.1 per 1,000 population.

There were 4.7 percent fewer infant deaths reported in 1976 as compared to 1975, resulting in an infant mortality rate of 15.1 deaths per 1,000 live births, compared with a rate of 15.7 in 1975. As recently as 1963 the infant mortality rate was 24.0 per 1,000 live births.

Fetal deaths are defined as deaths occurring prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of duration of pregnancy. Two terms synonymous with fetal death are still-birth, and spontaneous abortion. In New Jersey fetal deaths occurring twenty or more weeks following the estimated time of conception must be reported to the state registrar. There were 1,004 such reports in 1976 compared with 941 in 1975, an increase of 6.7 percent, resulting in a rate of 11.1 deaths per 1,000 live births. Despite this unexplained rise in the report of fetal deaths, the overall trend in fetal mortality over the past quarter century has been downward in nature. In 1952 there were 18.2 deaths per 1,000 live births, while as recently as 1963, 17.0 such deaths were reported per 1,000 live births.

Neonatal deaths include deaths occurring to infants during the first 28 days of life. In 1976 there were 1,034 neonatal deaths, or 75.7% of all infant deaths. The neonatal mortality rate was 11.4 per 1,000 births, the same as reported in 1975.

Maternal mortality has similarly decreased over the past 25 years. In 1952 there were 70 such deaths reported or 6.4 per 10,000 live births. In 1967, only 45 were reported or 3.9 per 10,000 live births. During the last four years there were 64 maternal deaths, or six fewer than reported for 1952 alone. In 1976 the 18 maternal deaths produced a rate of 2.0 per 10,000 live births.

BIRTHS

GENERAL INFORMATION: During 1976 there were 90,549 resident births recorded in New Jersey with an estimated birth rate of 12.2 per 1,000 persons, the lowest recorded birth rate in the State's history dating back to 1876. There were 90,224 births among women aged 15-44 resulting in a fertility rate of 55.2, representing a negligible decrease from the estimated rate of 56.6 reported one year earlier.

There were 70,457 births reported among the white population, a decrease of 1.6 percent from the 71,579 reported white births in 1975. A total of 18,611 nonwhite births were reported representing a 2.0% increase over the previous years figure of 18,248. An additional 1,481 births were reported for which no racial information was available. The birth rate for the white population was estimated to be between 10.8 and 11.0 births per 1,000 persons, while the nonwhite birth rate is estimated to fall within the range of 20.6 to 22.3, depending upon the allocation of birth data for which no racial information was given. The fertility rate, which is a measure of frequency of birth among women aged 15-44, was estimated to fall within the range of 49.8 to 50.9 for the white population, and 82.4 to 89.0 for the nonwhite population, again depending upon the allocation of data for which race was not given.

The months of July, August, September and October were the most popular months for producing children with 7,888, 7,900, 7,990 and 7,778 births occurring respectively. A total of 1,717 twins were born while 33 triplets were born. The number of multiple births (sets of twins and triplets) could not be ascertained from available data. There were 90,286 births (99.7%) in hospitals, of which 585 were delivered by a registered nurse. Midwives delivered 21 babies outside of hospitals, while 110 births occurred at home under the guidance of a physician or osteopath. Additionally there were 131 babies delivered elsewhere.

LEGITIMACY: Statistics for 1976 show an increase in the percent of illegitimate births occurring among both the white and nonwhite population. In 1976 there were 5,535 white illegitimate births, compared with 5,274 such births in 1975, an increase of 4.9 percent. There were 9,532 nonwhite illegitimate births in 1976 compared with 9,026 such births in 1975, an increase of 5.6 percent. During 1975 7.4 percent of reported white births were illegitimate. During 1976, 7.8 percent of white births were illegitimate. Of more startling significance are the figures for the nonwhite population. A total of 49.5 percent of nonwhite births in 1975 were illegitimate. In 1976 this figure (statewide) had risen to 51.2 percent. In fact, while the total number of births irrespective of race has decreased by 24.6 percent since 1970, the number of illegitimate births has risen 15.4 percent. There were 12,167 births to teenage mothers in 1976 compared to 12,566 such births in 1975, a decrease of 3.2 percent. However the number of illegitimate teenage births has increased 5.4 percent, with 7,069 births reported in 1976 compared to 6,705 in 1975. Illegitimate births represented 58.1 percent of all teenage births in 1976.

BIRTH WEIGHT: Birth weight information was given on 98.2 percent (88,923) of the birth certificates filed in 1976. There were 6,745 babies born weighing 2500 grams or less (immature) or 7.6 percent of all births for which weight information was available. In 1975 7.8 percent (6,973) were so classified. There were 4,318 (6.1%) low birth weight babies among the white population and 2,424 (13.0%) among the nonwhite population. By comparison, in 1975, 6.4% (4,555) of white births were immature while 13.2 percent (2,415) of nonwhite births weighed less than 2501 grams. Teenage mothers gave birth to 1,442 babies of low birth weight (11.9%) in 1976 while in 1975 1,478 (11.8%) fell into this category. Of the 15,053 illegitimate births for which birth weight information was available, 2,050 (13.6%) were classified as immature. In 1975, 13.9% of illegitimate births weighing less than 2500 grams were counted.

PRENATAL CARE HISTORY: In 1976, 91.5% (82,833) of the birth certificates had information as to prenatal care history. Of this total 737 (0.9%) did not give information as to the month of pregnancy that prenatal care was begun. In 1975, 91.3% of birth certificates were complete. Thus, there does not seem to be any improvement with regard to the reporting of this item on the birth certificate. Based upon available information in 1976, pregnant women visited the physician an average of slightly over 10 times prior to delivery. Prenatal care was started in the second month by 29,715 women (35.9%), in the third month by 23,286 women (28.1%), and in the fourth month by 9,334 women (11.3%). In 1975 prenatal history of pregnant women was similar, with the average woman visiting her physician just under 10 times, and most women beginning prenatal care during the first trimester of pregnancy.

RESIDENCY: The birth rates in 1976 for Sussex (17.5), Cumberland (15.7), Ocean (15.3), and Gloucester (14.5) Counties were the highest of the twenty-one counties, each, with the exception of Ocean county representing an increase over the reported rates for 1975. Bergen (9.1) Somerset (10.2), and Union (10.2) Counties reported the lowest rates. Among large municipalities, the birth rates for Camden (18.7), Newark (17.2), Paterson (17.9), Atlantic City (16.2), Passaic (16.0), Hoboken (15.9) and Trenton (15.8) far exceeded the state rate of (12.2).

MARRIAGES

The number of marriages decreased by 3.2 percent in 1976 when compared to 1975 (51,291 and 53,008 marriages respectively). In each of the two preceding years the marriage decline was rather substantial. The number of marriages in 1975 represented a decrease of 6.1% over 1974 (56,449), which in turn, represented a decrease of 5.5% from the reported 59,723 marriages in 1973. The number of marriages in 1973 represented the greatest number of marriages occurring in New Jersey during the past twenty-five years.

One in every five grooms (20.9%) married in New Jersey in 1976 had been previously married while 18.4 percent of brides had been previously married. There were 15,066 marriages (29.4%) involving one or more divorced participants. Of this total 5,057 (33.6%) involved a divorced bride and groom. One third of all marriages (17,027) involved one or more persons with previously marital experience. The percent of grooms with no previous marital experience has decreased substantially during the past few years. In 1974, 43,353 men married for the first time. In 1975 39,953 men were first time grooms and in 1976 only 38,246 men were married for the first time. Women followed a similar pattern with 44,754 marrying for the first time in 1974, 41,325 doing so in 1975, and 39,592 doing so in 1976. Thus, there has been a decrease of 11.8 percent in the number of first time bridegrooms since 1974, and a decrease of 11.5 percent decrease in first time brides. Conversely, the number of divorced grooms marrying again has increased from 10,495 in 1974 to 10,702 in 1976, an increase of 2.0 percent. Similarly, divorcees marrying again have increased from 9,129 in 1974 to 9,421 in 1976, an increase of 3.2 percent.

Brides were, traditionally, younger than grooms, with 61.2% of all brides falling in the under 25 category compared to 45.3% of all grooms. The average age of the 1976 bride is estimated to be 26.3 years while the average groom was 28.4 years of age. The number of teenage brides dropped from 11,882 in 1974 to 9,075 in 1976, a decrease of 23.6 percent. The number of teenage grooms dropped from 4,456 in 1974 to 3,249 in 1976, a decrease of 27.1 percent.

MORTALITY

RESIDENT DEATHS: In 1976 there were 65,276 resident deaths among New Jersey's 7,431,750 residents producing a mortality rate of 878.3 deaths per 100,000 persons. There were 30,965 white male deaths and 27,565 white female deaths resulting in mortality rates of 986.6 and 812.7 respectively. Among nonwhite males 3,812 deaths were reported with a mortality rate of 896.2 while 2,934 nonwhite female deaths produced a rate of 616.0 deaths per 100,000 persons. White male deaths decreased 1.2 percent, while white female deaths represented a negligible increase (0.5 percent) from 1975 reported deaths of 31,340 and 27,435 respectively. The 1975 estimated rate for white males was 998.2 while the estimated white female mortality rate was 810.4. There were 1.3 percent more nonwhite male deaths in 1976 compared with 1975 and 1.8 percent more nonwhite female deaths. In 1975, 3,764 nonwhite male and 2,883 nonwhite female deaths were reported, with race-sex specific rates of 896.8 and 613.4 deaths per 100,000, respectively. Thus overall crude mortality rates remained relatively unchanged. The greatest number of deaths occurred during the months of December, January and February with 5,841, 6,089 and 6,581 deaths reported respectively. There were 235 deaths each day in February. By contrast, fewest deaths were reported during the summer months, June through September, (5,006, 5,052, 4,995 and 4,944 respectively). On the average there were 161 deaths each day in August and 165 deaths per day in September.

INFANT, FETAL AND MATERNAL MORTALITY: Infant deaths include all deaths to babies under one year of age, no matter how short a period of time the baby breathed or showed other evidence of life. Most infant deaths occur during the first 27 days of life. These deaths are known as neonatal deaths. Infant deaths occurring after the child has lived 28 days or longer, but less than one year, are known as post-neonatal deaths. A fetal death is defined as a death occurring prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother, of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy. In New Jersey, all such deaths occurring after completion of 20 weeks gestation must be reported to the state registrar. It is these events which are the basis for fetal death statistics included in this report. Two commonly used synonyms for fetal death are stillbirth, and spontaneous abortion. The later term is not to be confused with the term "abortion", which is generally used to describe an induced abortion. Induced abortion statistics are not included in this report.

There were 1,366 infant deaths in 1976 compared with 1,434 in 1975, a decrease of 4.7 percent. The infant mortality rate (number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births) dropped from 15.7 to 15.1.

There were 893 infant deaths among whites and 473 infant deaths among the nonwhite population in 1976.

In 1975 there were 984 white infant deaths and 450 nonwhite infant deaths. Thus white infant deaths decreased 9.2 percent, while nonwhite infant deaths increased by 5.1 percent. In both 1975 and 1976 there were a large number of birth certificates for which racial information was unavailable. This makes a computation of exact infant mortality rates by race impossible. The white infant mortality rate is estimated to fall in the range of 12.4 to 12.7 depending upon the allocation of unknown information,

while the nonwhite infant mortality lays somewhere within the range 23.5 to 25.4. In 1975 the white infant mortality rate was somewhere within the range 13.4 to 13.7, thus showing, despite the poor data, that the white infant mortality rate declined in 1976. The nonwhite infant mortality rate in 1975 was within the range 22.6 to 24.7. It appears that the nonwhite infant mortality rate increased in 1976 although an exact measurement of this change cannot be made.

There were 1,034 neonatal deaths in 1976, 697 among the white population and 337 among the nonwhite population. The overall neonatal mortality rate was 11.4, the same as that reported in 1975. In 1975 there were 1,042 neonatal deaths, 729 among the white population and 313 among the nonwhite population. Thus, there were 4.4 percent fewer neonatal deaths in the white population and 7.7% more deaths in the nonwhite population. Neonatal mortality remained higher in the nonwhite population, although exact rates, could not be computed.

The fetal death rate in 1976 surpassed the rate reported in 1975. In 1976 there were 1,004 fetal deaths (11.1 per 1,000 live births), while in 1975, 941 deaths were reported (10.3 per 1,000 live births). There were 695 white fetal deaths, 301 nonwhite fetal deaths, and 8 fetal deaths unknown as to race, in 1976. In 1975 there were 663 white and 277 nonwhite fetal deaths. The increase in white fetal deaths was 4.8 percent, while nonwhite fetal deaths increased 8.7 percent. There were an estimated 9.7 to 10.0 white fetal deaths per 1,000 live births compared with 15.0 to 16.6 nonwhite fetal deaths per 1,000 live births in 1976. Again, exact computation of race-specific rates was not possible.

Perinatal mortality is used to measure mortality occurring during the later stages of pregnancy, and the early period of life. The World Health Organization offers two different measures of perinatal mortality. One method of computation involves measuring death occurring 28 weeks or more following conception up to and including the first week of life. The second definition includes all deaths occurring following completion of twenty or more weeks gestation, and after birth up to 27 days of life, or, in other words, all fetal deaths recorded in New Jersey plus neonatal deaths. It is the second definition that is used in the computation of perinatal mortality rates included in this report. The perinatal mortality rate in New Jersey has steadily decreased in New Jersey as both fetal mortality and neonatal mortality have decreased. As recently as 1967 there were 3,883 perinatal deaths with a rate of 32.9. In 1976 there were 2,038 perinatal deaths, a decrease of 47.5 percent resulting in a rate of 22.3 deaths per 1,000 live births plus fetal deaths. There were 1,392 white deaths and 638 nonwhite deaths, with 8 deaths unknown as to race.

Maternal Mortality has decreased dramatically during the past twenty-five years. In 1952 there were 70 maternal deaths or 6.4 deaths per 10,000 live births. In 1970 there were 38 maternal deaths or 3.2 deaths per 10,000 live births. The number of maternal deaths over the past four years has remained relatively unchanged. There were 16, 16, 14 and 18 maternal deaths in 1973, 1974, 1975 and 1976 respectively. The 1976 rate was 2.0 per 10,000 live births, a slight increase from the reported rate of 1.7 in 1974 and 1975.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF INFANT MORTALITY: The ten leading causes of infant mortality in 1976 were; 1) Congenital anomalies 2) Complications of pregnancy 3) Immaturity, unqualified 4) Respiratory distress syndrome 5) Asphyxia of newborn 6) Symptoms and ill-defined conditions 7) Hyaline membrane disease 8) All other conditions of newborn 9) Pneumonia and 10) Birth injury without mention of cause. The number of deaths resulting from complications of pregnancy, all other conditions of newborn, and birth injury without mention of cause increased. There were fewer infant deaths attributed to each of the seven remaining causes of infant deaths.

There were 241 deaths resulting from congenital anomalies in 1976 compared with 269 in 1975 a decrease of 10.4 percent. Congenital anomalies include Anencephalus (27), Congenital anomalies of the heart (71), Congenital anomalies of the respiratory system (26), and congenital syndromes affecting multiple systems (30). Congenital anomalies accounted for 17.6 percent of infant deaths in 1976.

There were 132 deaths due to complications of pregnancy or 9.7 percent of 1976 infant deaths. In 1975 a total of 111 such deaths were reported. Toxemia of pregnancy, maternal ante- and intrapartum infection, and difficult labor resulted in a total of 8 deaths while all other complications of pregnancy and childbirth accounted for 124 deaths.

There were 126 deaths due to immaturity, unqualified, in 1976 compared with 134 in 1975, a decrease of 6.0 percent. Respiratory distress syndrome resulted in 122 deaths in 1976 compared with 128 in 1975, a decrease of 4.7 percent. Asphyxia of the newborn resulted in 118 deaths in 1976, a decrease of 9.9 percent from the reported 131 deaths one year earlier.

Symptoms and ill-defined conditions was the second leading cause of death in 1975 with 147 deaths reported. In 1976 only 103 such deaths were reported, a decrease of 29.9 percent, making this the 6th leading cause of death.

PRINCIPAL CAUSES OF DEATH: The ten leading causes of death in 1976 were; 1) Diseases of the Heart 2) Malignant Neoplasms 3) Cerebrovascular disease 4) Accidents 5) Influenza and Pneumonia 6) Diabetes Mellitus 7) Cirrhosis of the Liver 8) Other Diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries 9) Certain causes of mortality in early infancy and 10) Arteriosclerosis.

There were 27,613 deaths (371.6 per 100,000) due to diseases of the heart in 1976, compared with 27,378 (369.2 per 100,000) in 1975, an increase of 0.9 percent. Diseases of the heart were the leading cause of death of white males 25 years of age and older, white females 65 years of age and older, nonwhite males 45 and older and nonwhite females 45 and older, and accounted for 42.3 percent of all New Jersey resident deaths.

There were 14,585 resident deaths in 1976 due to malignant neoplasms, an increase of 1.4 percent from the reported 14,377 deaths in 1975. The mortality rate increased from 193.9 to 196.3 deaths per 100,000 population, one of the highest rates in the country. Malignant neoplasms remained the leading cause of death of persons aged 25-44, and the second leading cause of death among persons 45 years of age and older. The mortality rate was higher among whites than nonwhite and among males. There were 6,922 white

male deaths attributed to cancer, producing a rate of 220.6 almost unchanged from the reported rate of 220.2 in 1975. Among white females there were 6,336 deaths (186.8 per 100,000), in 1976, compared with 6,210 deaths in 1975 (183.4 per 100,000). Similar increases in mortality among the nonwhite population were evidenced. A total of 760 nonwhite male deaths in 1976 produced a rate of 178.7 compared with a 1975 rate of 170.4. A 5.6 percent increase in nonwhite female deaths resulted in a 1976 rate of 119.0 compared with a 1975 rate of 114.3.

There were 5.6 percent fewer deaths in 1976 attributed to cerebrovascular disease than were reported in 1975. The result was a decrease in the rate from 78.6 per 100,000 to 74.1 per 100,000. Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death of white males 65 and older, and among all other persons 45 years of age and older.

The three leading causes of death accounted for 73.1 percent of all resident deaths in 1976. The other seven leading causes of death accounted for 16.7 percent of all deaths.

There were 2,520 deaths due to accidents in 1976 compared to 2,602 in 1975, a decrease of 3.2 percent. Influenza and pneumonia resulted in 1,824 deaths in 1976 compared to 1,616 in 1975, an increase of 12.9 percent. Diabetes Mellitus, the sixth leading cause of death resulted in 1,311 deaths in 1976 and 1,416 deaths in 1975, a decrease of 7.4 percent. There were 1,267 deaths caused by cirrhosis of the liver in 1976 and 1,235 such deaths in 1975, a 2.6 percent increase. Other diseases of the arteries, arterioles, and capillaries were responsible for 824 and 802 deaths in 1976 and 1975 respectively. There were 799 deaths in 1976 and 802 deaths in 1975 due to certain causes of mortality in early infancy. Arteriosclerosis resulted in 713 deaths in 1976 compared to 758 deaths in 1975, a decrease of 5.9 percent.

Accidents were the leading cause of death among children and young people under 25 years of age. Cancer caused the greatest number of deaths among the population aged 25-44. Diseases of the heart, the leading cause of death among persons aged 65 and older resulted in 38.7 percent of deaths in that age group.

MAJOR CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES: Included in the general category of major cardiovascular diseases are 1) Diseases of the Heart 2) Hypertension 3) Cerebrovascular disease 4) Arteriosclerosis and 5) Other diseases of the arteries, arterioles and capillaries. There were 34,839 resident deaths attributed to this broad category in 1976, while in 1975, 34,978 such deaths were reported. The mortality rate in 1976 was 468.8, while in 1975 a rate of 471.7 was recorded.

There were 27,613 deaths (371.6 per 100,000) due to diseases of the heart in 1976, the leading cause of death among white males 25 years of age and older, white females 65 years and older, and nonwhite males and females aged 45 and older. Although the mortality rate was higher in 1976 than in 1975 when 369.2 deaths per 100,000 persons were attributed to this cause, for the past 14 years the mortality rate has gradually decreased. In 1963 there were 430.4 deaths per 100,000, and in 1970, 408.1 deaths per 100,000

were reported. Included in the category are deaths caused by acute myocardial infarction (11,859) and chronic ischemic heart disease (13,639). These two subcategories accounted for 92.3 percent of deaths attributed to heart disease. There were 1.7 percent fewer deaths due to acute myocardial infarction in 1976 as compared to 1975 when 12,069 deaths were reported. The estimated mortality rate in 1976 was 159.6 compared to a 1975 rate of 162.8. In 1975, 13,328 deaths were attributed to ischemic heart disease. Thus the 1976 total represented a 2.3 percent increase, and the mortality rates in 1975 and 1976 were 179.8 and 183.5 respectively.

The mortality rates for diseases of the heart were substantially higher in the white population, and particularly high among men. There were 13,701 white male deaths (436.6 per 100,000), 11,819 white female deaths (348.5 per 100,000), 1,141 nonwhite male deaths (268.3 per 100,000), and 952 nonwhite female deaths (200.0 per 100,000) in 1976. The mortality rates in each race-sex group, with the exception of white males, represented minor increases over 1975 estimated rates. The white male mortality rate represented a negligible decrease.

Hypertension resulted in the deaths of 185 New Jersey residents (2.5 deaths per 100,000). Included in this category are malignant hypertension, essential benign hypertension and hypertensive renal disease. Excluded from this category are hypertensive heart disease (200 deaths) and hypertensive heart and renal disease (101 deaths).

Cerebrovascular disease was the third leading cause of death among white males, white females, and nonwhite females, and the fourth leading cause of death of nonwhite males. There were 5,504 deaths in 1976 (74.1 per 100,000) in 1976, compared to 5,831 deaths in 1975 (78.6 per 100,000), a decrease of 5.6 percent. Mortality was higher in the white population, with female mortality, substantially higher than male specific mortality rates. There were 2,066 white male deaths and 2,925 white female deaths, with mortality rates of 65.8 and 86.2 respectively. A total of 206 nonwhite male and 307 nonwhite female deaths were reported with mortality rates of 48.4 and 64.5 respectively. Mortality rates increased with age. The seventh leading cause of death of persons 25-44 resulted in 126 deaths (6.9 per 100,000). Among persons aged 45-64, 822 deaths were reported (47.9 per 100,000), while 4,534 persons aged 65 and over died (585.3 per 100,000), making cerebrovascular disease the third leading cause of death among those aged 45 and older. Cerebrovascular disease includes cerebral thrombosis (1,598 deaths), acute but ill-defined cerebrovascular disease (1,562 deaths), generalized ischemic cerebrovascular disease (986 deaths), cerebral hemorrhage (880 deaths), and other types of cerebrovascular disease (478 deaths).

Arteriosclerosis is a disease which generally strikes the elderly. In 1976 there were 713 deaths attributed to arteriosclerosis (9.6 per 100,000), making this the tenth leading cause of death. In 1975, 758 deaths were reported (10.2 per 100,000). The decrease was 5.9 percent. Among persons aged 65 and older, 674 deaths were attributed to this disease (94.5 percent of total arteriosclerotic deaths). There were 7.6 deaths per 100,000 white males, 12.7 deaths per 100,000 white females, 4.2 deaths per 100,000 nonwhite males, and 5.5 deaths per 100,000 nonwhite females.

Other diseases of the arteries, arterioles, and capillaries caused the deaths of 457 white males, 304 white females, 41 nonwhite males, and 22 nonwhite females, with mortality rates of 14.6, 9.0, 9.6, and 4.6 respectively. There were 824 total deaths (11.1 per 100,000) in 1976, compared with 810 deaths (10.9 per 100,000) in 1975. Of the total there were 159 deaths (9.3 per 100,000) among persons aged 45-64, and 642 deaths (82.9 per 100,000) among the elderly (65+).

MALIGNANT NEOPLASMS: There were 1.4 percent more deaths in 1976 than in 1975 due to malignant neoplasms. The mortality rate (196.3) far exceeds the national mortality rate, and continues to steadily rise. There were 6,922 white male deaths, 6,336 white female deaths, 760 nonwhite male deaths and 567 nonwhite female deaths. Male mortality rates exceed female rates and mortality among whites far exceeds nonwhite mortality. There were 220.6 deaths per 100,000 white males, 186.8 deaths per 100,000 white females, 178.7 deaths per 100,000 nonwhite males and 119.0 deaths per 100,000 nonwhite females.

Among the more prevalent forms of cancer there were 3,246 deaths due to trachea, bronchus and lung cancer, 1,905 deaths resulting from cancer of the large intestine (excluding the rectum), 1,432 breast cancer deaths, 741 deaths resulting from cancer of the pancreas, and 649 deaths resulting from stomach cancer. Lung cancer deaths increased 3.0 percent from the reported 3,150 deaths in 1975. The mortality rates in 1975 and 1976 were 42.5 and 43.7 respectively. Deaths due to cancer of the large intestine increased 4.7 percent compared to a reported 1,819 deaths in 1975. The mortality rate increased from 24.5 to 25.6 per 100,000. There were 1,360 breast cancer deaths in 1975 with an overall mortality rate of 18.3 per 100,000 population, and 35.2 per 100,000 women. In 1976 the rate per 100,000 population was 19.3 and the rate per 100,000 women was 37.0. There were 735 pancreatic cancer deaths and 692 stomach cancer deaths in 1975, with rates of 9.9 and 9.3 respectively. The mortality rate for pancreatic cancer in 1976 was 10.0 while there were 8.7 deaths per 100,000 due to stomach cancer.

The highest 1976 cancer mortality rates were found in Ocean County (341.2), Cape May County (330.2), Atlantic County (269.5), Monmouth County (217.1), and Hudson County (214.8). However these rates were not adjusted for age differences due to lack of population estimates. In older populations one can expect the mortality rates to be substantially higher. The high rates found in these counties can probably be explained by the presence of many retirement communities and nursing homes.

ACCIDENTS: Accidents were the fourth leading cause of death and the number one cause of death among young people under 25 years of age. There were 2,520 accidental resident deaths in 1976 (33.9 per 100,000) compared with 2,602 in 1975 (35.1 per 100,000) a decrease of 3.2 percent. There were 74 deaths of children aged 1-4 (36.1 percent of total deaths aged 1-4), 167 deaths among children 5-14 (47.0 percent of total), and 590 deaths among persons aged 15-24 (50.9% of total). The mortality rate among the elderly, however, remained the highest. A total of 609 such deaths produced a rate of 78.6 deaths per 100,000 persons aged 65 and older.

Accidental deaths were significantly more prevalent among males and among the nonwhite population. There were 1,387 white male deaths and 672 white female deaths producing rates of 44.2 and 19.8 respectively. Among nonwhite males there were 338 deaths (79.5 per 100,000), while 123 nonwhite female deaths produced a rate of 25.8 per 100,000. With the exception of nonwhite males, there were slight decreases in the mortality rates in 1976 compared with 1975 and preceding years.

Motor Vehicles traffic accidents accounted for 1,042 resident deaths in 1976 compared to 1,079 such deaths in 1975. The mortality rate decreased from 14.6 to 14.0 per 100,000. There were 26.9 motor vehicle traffic deaths per 100,000 persons aged 15-24. There were an additional 28 deaths which were motor vehicle related. A total of 1,058 motor vehicle deaths occurred in New Jersey, involving both residents and non-residents.

Falls claimed the lives of 485 residents in 1976 compared to 554 in 1975, a decrease of 12.5 percent. Of the total 64.9 percent (315) involved persons aged 65 and older, and 19.6 percent (95) involved persons between the ages of 45 and 64.

Fire claimed the lives of 184 residents, with the highest mortality occurring among the very young (under 5) and the elderly (65+). In 1975 there were 204 deaths due to fire and flames.

There were 108 accidental deaths, the result of drowning, and 117 deaths resulting from ingestion of food causing obstruction and suffocation. Drowning deaths decreased 11.5 percent from the reported 122 such deaths in 1975, while deaths caused by choking on food increased 42.7 percent (82 deaths in 1975).

INFLUENZA AND PNEUMONIA: Influenza and pneumonia accounted for 1,824 deaths in 1976 (24.5 per 100,000) while in 1975, 1,616 such deaths occurred (21.8 per 100,000). There were 1,706 deaths due to pneumonia and 118 deaths due to influenza in 1976, while in 1975 there were 1,567 deaths due to pneumonia and only 49 deaths attributed to influenza. There were 856 white male deaths in 1976 and 115 nonwhite male deaths producing similar rates (27.3 and 27.0 respectively). Rates for females were somewhat lower with 776 white females and 77 nonwhite female deaths producing rates of 22.9 and 16.2 respectively. Influenza and pneumonia becomes more serious in the elderly as evidenced by the 1,370 deaths of persons aged 65 and older (176.9 per 100,000). Influenza and pneumonia was the fourth leading cause of death of the elderly.

DIABETES MELLITUS: The sixth leading cause of death among all residents and the fifth leading cause of death among the elderly resulted in 1,311 deaths in 1976 and 1,416 deaths in 1975, a decrease of 7.4 percent. There were 452 white male deaths (14.4 per 100,000) and 60 nonwhite male deaths (14.1 per 100,000) in 1976. Female mortality rates were higher with 678 white and 121 nonwhite female deaths producing rates of 20.0 and 25.4 respectively. Better than 72 percent of diabetes deaths occurred among persons aged 65 and older.

CIRRHOSIS OF THE LIVER: Deaths due to this ailment occur more frequently among the nonwhite population and among men. In 1976 there were 21.2 deaths per 100,000 white males and 32.2 deaths per 100,000 nonwhite males. Among white females there were 11.1 deaths per 100,000 while 18.3 deaths per 100,000 females were reported. Cirrhosis of the liver is the seventh leading cause of death, and resulted in 1,267 deaths in 1976 compared with 1,235 in 1975. Most deaths occurred in the age group 45-64, with 669 deaths producing a rate of 39.0 per 100,000, fourth highest in that age group. There were 64 deaths among nonwhite men aged 45-64 producing a rate of 94.8 per 100,000.

BRONCHITIS, ASTHMA AND EMPHYSEMA: In 1976 there were 651 deaths attributed to this group of related diseases (8.8 per 100,000), while in 1975 the comparative figure was 664 (9.0 per 100,000). There were 422 white male deaths, 178 white female deaths, 35 nonwhite male deaths and 16 nonwhite female deaths. The white male mortality rate was 13.4, compared with the nonwhite male mortality rate of 8.2. The rates for white and nonwhite females were 5.2 and 3.4 respectively. Chronic and unqualified bronchitis accounted for 132 resident deaths, emphysema was responsible for 479 resident deaths, and asthma caused the deaths of 40 residents. Very few deaths due to this disease group occur in the young. Only 24 deaths involved persons under 45 years of age in 1976. Of this total 14 deaths were due to asthma, and 5 each, due to bronchitis and emphysema.

SUICIDE: There were 577 suicide deaths in 1976 compared to 612 deaths in 1975 a decrease of 5.7 percent. Despite the decline, suicide remained the 12th leading cause of death of New Jersey residents. There were 109 deaths among persons aged 15-24, 169 deaths of persons aged 25-44, 200 deaths of persons aged 45-64 and 96 deaths among persons aged 65 and older. The mortality rates were 8.0, 9.2, 11.7 and 12.4 respectively. Suicide was the second leading cause of death of white males aged 15-24 with 78 deaths producing a rate of 13.1 per 100,000. However, among white males the mortality rate for persons aged 65 and older was the highest (22.0) based on 63 deaths. Among nonwhite males there were 22 deaths in the 25-44 year age group producing a rate of 21.1, the fourth highest mortality rate in that age group. Female mortality rates were somewhat lower. Most frequent suicides among white females occurred in the age group 45-64 (7.8 per 100,000) based on 64 deaths, while 5 reported suicides among nonwhite females aged 25-44 produced a rate of 3.8.

HOMICIDE: There were 405 resident deaths as a result of homicide and legal intervention in 1976. The mortality rate was 5.4 per 100,000 estimated population. In 1975 there were 520 deaths resulting from homicide, with a rate of 7.0. While homicide deaths declined 22.1 percent, the problem remained critical among the black male population. There were 129 homicide deaths among white males (4.1 per 100,000), and 157 homicide deaths among nonwhite males (36.9 per 100,000), a nine fold difference in rates. Among white females 67 deaths were the result of homicide (2.0 per 100,000), while 52 deaths among nonwhite females (10.0 per 100,000) were recorded. Homicide was the second leading cause of death among nonwhite males aged 15-24, and the third leading cause of death of nonwhite males aged 25-44. There were 41 and 76 deaths in these two age group respectively, with mortality rates of 46.2 and 72.8 per 100,000. Among nonwhite males there were 23.8 percent fewer deaths in 1976 than in 1975 so that some progress seems apparent in preventing such unnecessary deaths.

MORBIDITY

Morbidity data are collected and compiled for all reportable diseases in New Jersey. The Tuberculosis Services Program collects information on all tuberculosis cases occurring in New Jersey. Incidence data on syphilis and gonorrhea are collected by the Venereal Disease Control Program. Information on other diseases which are, by law, required to be reported, are collected by the Communicable Disease Program of the Division of Laboratories and Epidemiology. These diseases include amebiasis, aseptic meningitis, brucellosis, malaria, measles (rubeola), meningococcal infections, mumps, pertussis, rubella, salmonellosis, shigellosis, tetanus, trichinosis, tularemia, typhoid fever, and typhus. The Hepatitis Surveillance Program receives reports of all cases of hepatitis.

Information on more prevalent diseases, such as cancer and heart disease, is not now presently being collected. A Cancer Registry is now being developed and valuable data regarding this disease will be available in the future.

TUBERCULOSIS: The tuberculosis incidence rate in New Jersey has steadily decreased during the past twenty-five years, as has mortality due to tuberculosis. The incidence rate decreased from 18.4 per 100,000 in 1975 based on 1,362 cases, to 17.7 per 100,000 based on 1,317 newly reported cases in 1976. In 1955 there were 3,665 newly reported cases with an incidence rate of 66.9 per 100,000 population.

The largest declines in incidence rates occurred in the State's largest cities. In Newark the rate dropped from 68.8 to 57.6. In Jersey City the rate dropped from 47.0 to 42.9 per 100,000. Paterson's rate dropped from 65.7 to 41.4. In some of the other larger cities the tuberculosis rates remained the same or rose slightly. Camden City's rate increased from 32.5 to 37.8; North Bergen Township's rate increased from 10.4 to 24.9, and in Elizabeth City the rate rose from 32.3 to 40.1 per 100,000 persons. Incidence rates in large urban areas remain higher than those reported for smaller cities, and suburban and rural communities. Presumably, data collection methods and their accuracy are reasonably similar.

The incidence rate for males remains substantially higher than the incidence rate among women. There were 795 newly reported cases among men and 522 newly reported cases among women, with incidence rates of 22.2 and 13.5 respectively. From the age of five and up, the incidence rate appears to increase with age. The rate for men increases sharply with age, while the rate among women increases more gradually by comparison.

There were 112 deaths due to tuberculosis in 1976 compared to 122 in 1975, with rates of 1.5 and 1.6 respectively.

VENEREAL DISEASE: The number of civilian cases of syphilis has decreased over the last four years. In 1973 there were 2,895 cases of syphilis (39.3 per 100,000). By 1976 this number had decreased to 2,180 (29.3 per 100,000 population). There were an additional 27 military cases in 1976, or 2,207 total cases of syphilis reported in 1976. There were 570 cases of primary

and secondary syphilis reported in 1976 compared to 771 cases in 1975, a decrease of 26.1 percent. A total of 594 cases of early latent syphilis were reported, compared to 666 cases in 1975, a decrease of 10.8 percent. The number of cases of late and late latent syphilis reported, increased 5.7 percent, with 1,021 cases reported in 1976 compared to 966 in 1975. A total of 22 cases of congenital syphilis were reported compared to 28 cases in 1975. Of the total cases of syphilis reported in 1975, 39.7 percent were late or late latent cases, while in 1976 46.3 percent of cases were so classified. Thus, although the number of cases of syphilis reported has decreased, the percentage of cases discovered in the later stages, has increased.

The cities of Trenton, East Orange, and Newark reported the highest incidence of syphilis (all stages). There were 168.5 cases per 100,000 population in Trenton in 1976, compared to 176.3 cases per 100,000 in 1975. East Orange showed an increase from 131.4 in 1975 to 140.1 cases reported per 100,000 population in 1976. Newark's rate dropped substantially with 179.0 cases per 100,000 reported in 1975 compared to 139.7 cases per 100,000 reported in 1976.

The number of newly reported cases of gonorrhea has multiplied almost five fold since 1964. In 1964 there were 3,744 newly reported cases compared to 17,708 in 1976. Inclusion of military cases brings the total number of newly reported cases of gonorrhea to 18,278. Incidence rates have increased accordingly. The increased incidence of gonorrhea reflects both improved surveillance as well as an actual increase in gonorrhea cases.

Better than 30 percent of all gonorrhea cases involved persons between the ages of 20 and 24 (6,360). In 1975 there were 6,380 cases reported among persons in this age group. The incidence rate for this age group dropped from 1,041.1 to 1,002.6 per 100,000 persons, or one case for every one hundred persons aged 20-24. There were 5,027 cases among persons age 15-19, an increase of 1.9 percent from the reported 4,935 cases in 1975. The incidence rate rose from 680.7 to 696.9 per 100,000 persons aged 15-19.

The incidence rate for Newark was the highest (1,441.7) and represented an increase from the reported rate of 1,355.0 in 1975. Newark accounted for 29.4 percent of all gonorrhea cases in the state. Trenton reported a rate of 1,418.2, compared to 1,500.6 in 1975. The rates for these two cities were exceptionally high when compared to an overall state rate of 245.9 cases per 100,000 residents.

HEPATITIS: There were 859 cases of Serum Hepatitis reported in 1976 compared to 1,235 in 1975, a decrease of 30.4 percent. The incidence rate declined from 16.6 to 11.6 per 100,000 population. Infectious Hepatitis cases decreased from 952 to 937, with a rate drop from 12.8 to 12.6. There were 375 cases of hepatitis (unspecified) in 1975, compared to 448 cases in 1976, an increase of 19.5 percent.

There were 567 cases of infectious hepatitis among persons aged 15-29 (30.2 per 100,000), with 370 cases reported among all other persons (6.7 per 100,000). Persons aged 20-24 reported 217 cases (34.2 per 100,000) in 1976, the highest age-specific rate. A total of 555 cases (64.6 percent of total) of serum hepatitis occurred among persons aged 15-29, with the incidence being highest among persons age 20-24 (42.4) based on 269 cases.

Hepatitis is more prevalent among males with 1,273 total cases producing a rate of 35.7 per 100,000, compared to 971 female cases and a rate of 25.1 per 100,000. This relationship holds true for all forms of hepatitis.

OTHER NOTIFIABLE DISEASES: There were 99 cases of amebiasis in 1976 compared with 81 cases in 1975 an increase of 22.2 percent. Aseptic meningitis cases decreased 42.9 percent (345 in 1975 compared to 197 in 1976). There were 44.7 percent more cases of measles (rubeola) (690 in 1976, 477 in 1975). The number of cases of mumps increased 29.7 percent (465 in 1975, 603 in 1976). Rubella cases increased 45.2 percent (1,021 in 1975, 1,483 in 1976). There were 8.3 percent more cases of salmonellosis, (1,118 in 1975, 1,211 in 1976). There were 255 cases of shigellosis in 1975 and 186 in 1976 a decrease of 27.1 percent. A total of 47 cases of trichinosis were recorded in 1975, and only 7 cases in 1976.

APPENDIX A

Glossary of Terms

AGE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of persons of a given age group per 100,000 estimated persons in that age group usually expressed as an annual rate.

CAUSE GROUP - a summary of deaths resulting from, or cases of, related diseases as defined by the International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States, published by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; usually specified by a series of 3-digit codes i.e. 140-209 - malignant neoplasms.

CAUSE-3 DIGIT - the cause of death or morbidity as defined by a 3-digit code in the International List. Disease conditions are also further classified and so specified, by the addition of a decimal point and a fourth digit. For example, the three digit code "140" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lip, and the four digit code "140.1" refers to a malignant neoplasm of the lower lip.

ESTIMATED POPULATION - the estimated number of persons in a given group based on the latest census data and adjusted for annual births, annual deaths and net migration.

FETAL DEATH - a death prior to complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy also known as a stillbirth. The death of an infant that has breathed or shown other evidence of life, no matter for how short a period, should be reported as a live birth and an infant death.

FETAL DEATH RATES - the number of fetal deaths occurring in the twentieth week of gestation or later (required by law to be registered as fetal deaths) per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

FERTILITY RATE - the number of live births to women aged 15-44 per 1,000 women in this age group, usually expressed as an annual rate.

ILLEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to an unwed mother, or to a mother whose husband did not father the infant.

ILLEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to an unwed mother, or a mother whose husband did not father the fetus.

INFANT DEATH - the death of a baby under one year of age, no matter how short a period a time the baby breathed or shown other evidence of life.

INFANT MORTALITY RATE - the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

INTERNATIONAL LIST - a listing of disease classifications known as the "Eighth Revision International Classification of Diseases Adapted For Use in the United States", published by the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, used in the statistical coding and tabulation of specific disease morbidity and mortality.

LEGITIMATE BIRTH - a birth to a married woman whose husband fathered the infant.

LEGITIMATE FETAL DEATH - a fetal death occurring to a married woman whose husband fathered the fetus.

MATERNAL DEATH - a death of a woman occurring during the period of pregnancy or following delivery of the infant and related to the pregnancy or delivery of the infant.

MATERNAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of maternal deaths per 10,000 live births, usually expressed as an annual rate.

MORBIDITY - the relative incidence (number of cases) of disease, usually used with respect to specific disease conditions i.e. tuberculosis morbidity refers to the number of cases of tuberculosis.

MORTALITY - the number of deaths.

NEONATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the newborn and especially the human infant during the first month of life.

NEONATAL MORTALITY RATE - as used in this text, the number of deaths of infants under 28 days of age per 1,000 live births, per year.

NET MIGRATION - the difference in population resulting from persons attaining residency status, and persons dropping residency status, often referred to as in-migration and out-migration, respectively.

PERINATAL - of, relating to, or affecting the fetus and the newborn, especially the human infant during the first month of life.

PERINATAL MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of infants less than 28 days of age, and registered fetal deaths per 1,000 live births plus registered fetal deaths.

RACE-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths in a given ethnic group per 100,000 estimated population in that ethnic group.

SELECTED PLACES - as used in this report, cities, townships and municipalities with a population of 45,000 or more as of the 1970 census.

SEX-SPECIFIC MORTALITY RATE - the number of deaths of males/females per 100,000 estimated males/females in the population.
